A HELPFUL GROUP FOR WIDOWS AND WIDOWERS WITH CHILDREN

Widows and widowers with children encounter new problems. Many difficulties have been overcome already by other widowed parents through a group called Parents Without Partners. Parents Without Partners is concerned with the interests and welfare of single parents and their children. The group operates 13 chapters across Canada with more than 1,600 members. Depending on the size of the group, they meet either weekly or monthly.

The recovery process for the widowed parent starts with orientation sessions which help them adjust to their new situation. As recovery proceeds, the parent attends seminars on how to raise children as a single parent and becomes involved in an active social program of sports, dances and dinners.

This group should be considered by all widows and widowers with children as they get ready to re-enter social life. For more information, call Parents Without Partners head office in Toronto at (416) 363-0960.
