Escapist entertainment is what always goes over best at the summer box-office, and it is no coincidence that this season has seen the release not only of the third Star Wars installment but of the third Superman movie as well.

Alexander and Ilya Salkind, the producers of The Three Musketeers, came up with the idea of a high-budget big-screen come-back for Superman, about six years ago. With special effects being in the advanced state that they are today, the Salkinds realized that a series of movies could be made for a new generation which would do justice to comic books' most durable superhero.

The three Superman movies made a star out of unknown actor Christopher Reeve, who by general consensus is the best Superman the movies have ever had. Unfortunately, the public has not responded to Reeve nearly as well in his non-Superman roles like Monsignor and Somewhere In Time. There is always the danger in an actor's life of being typecast, particularly in such a well-defined role as Superman.

The first Superman movie had an interesting villainous characterization by Gene Hackman in the role of Lex Luthor. The three villains in Superman II were Superman's deadly adversaries from Krypton, who were far more menacing than the somewhat comic Luthor. Superman III marks a return to the more comic-strip type of villains. Robert Vaughan portrays a greedy power-hungry tycoon, who is being aided in his quest for world power by a computer genius, played by Richard Pryor of all people.

I was afraid at first that comedian Pryor might ruin the movie and throw it off balance with his distinct brand of comedy, but he contributes to the overall entertainment value of the story once we get used to it. And Superman III is not all comedy, as some reviewers have reported. Like the first two movies in the series it maintains a good balance between tongue-in-cheek and more serious dimensions.

In Superman III there is a new romance for our superhero. Clark Kent returns to his hometown of Smallville for a high school reunion, where he resumes a friendship with one of his old classmates Lana Lang. Another interesting plot development in Superman III occurs when the villains manufacture what they hope is kryptonite, the only substance which can destroy Superman.

It doesn't, but what it does do is alter his personality. The man of steel ends up becoming a mean, selfish and nasty character, the complete opposite of Superman. And in another highly imaginative scene Superman's dual personality splits, and the two personalities have a mammoth fightto-the finish battle of titanic proportions.

In short, this new Superman installment has much to offer viewers who have been following this series. There is action and good special effects, comedy provided by by Richard Pryor, romance courtesy of Annette O'Toole who plays Lana Lang, and another excellent Superman characterization by Christopher Reeve.


