year, the Canadian Heart Fund, Ontario Division, has reached its \$8.45 million annual campaign objective.

The 1983 campaign, which was conducted during February in Ontario, exceeded its goal by \$28,611.

Door-to-door canvassing, special events, corporate solicitations, the sale of 'Roses for Research', and In Memoriam donations: all contributed to the total of \$8,478,611.

Requests and other sources of income, combined with campaign reciepts, will allow the Ontario Heart Foundation to allocate \$11,200,000 to heart disease and stroke research in Ontario, for the 1983-84 granting period.

In presenting his report, Alex Broomfield, the 1983 Canadian Heart Fund Chairman said, "The residents in the province of Ontario can be proud of their substantial contributions to the crusade against heart disease and stroke. Evidence to date, that research has paid off, is in the fact that the overall death rate from heart and blood vessel diseases, for people under 65 years of age, is down 27 per cent since 1953.

In heart attack, the single leading cause of death in Canada, the decline has only been 11 per cent. He coninued by saying that the residents of Ontario have endorsed the work of the Ontario Heart Foundation, through their continuous support

At the close of its over the years, and that vital medical research in the area of heart disease and stroke will continue to receive the financial support of the

Foundation.

In conclusion, and on behalf of the Canadian Heart Fund, Ontario Division, Broomfield expressed "heartfelt"

thanks to the thousands of volunteer workers and canvassers in the province, for their tremendous support of the 1983 campaign.

Major injury in Tiny

During the week ending Aug. 2, Midland OPP investigated 19 motor vehicle collisions. Five of these involved personal injuries. Three were classified as non-reportable.

Beaten, robbed, police think

Chester Sawyers, 60, of Meldrum, Ont. was reportedly beaten and robbed of approximately \$150 cash on July 30. The victim was found by passing motorists, lying in his pick-up truck, on Hwy 12 at the 8th Concession of Tay.

He was taken to Huronia District Hospital and later moved to Toronto General, where he remains in stable condition with serious face and head injuries, and broken ribs. Police are investigating.

Victoria Harbour robbery reported

Two suspects have been charged with robbery in connection with an incident at the home of George Latondress in Victoria Harbour on July 26.

Charged are Michael Keith Rudge, 17, of North York, and Ross Alexander Moreau, 27, of Victoria Harbour.

Police say Latondress was tied up and his head covered by a jacket while his wallet and a small home safe were taken. Approximately \$60 was stolen.

Before leaving the scene, the phone was pulled from its connection, police say.
