## RC Board meeting

Simcoe County Roman Catholic Separate School Board decided at its special Aug. 17 meeting to proceed with purchase of a site and construction of Phase One of Ecole St. Louis in Penetanguishene.

The decision resulted from a capital allocation from BILD funds as announced by the Minister of Education in early August.

The Board is assuring the Minister that it will proceed with due speed in order that employment might be created this fall as is the intention. The first phase will include a junior kindergarten classroom, kindergarten classroom, and six regular classrooms.

Committee Chairman Art Beausoleil reported that an approach has been made to the Town of Penetanguishene to purchase a town-owned

site on Dufferin Street. He noted that the town fathers were very interested particularly at the prospect of creating employment in the area this fall.

The Board has authorized Architect W.H. Nesbitt to proceed full speed ahead on design in order that the Board will fulfill its commitment to the Minister to provide employment as soon as possible.

Estimated cost of the first phase of the new school is \$500,000 to be expended in 1983 to an amount of \$300,000 and a further \$200,000 in January and February.

**TRANSPORTATION**  
 Simcoe County Roman Catholic Separate School Board approved transportation contracts for the 1983-1984 school year at its Aug. 17 meeting. Cost increases approved were at 2.28 per cent on

the basic rate and 17.52 per cent on the mileage rate for an average of 4.98 per cent. The Agreement provides for gas increases should they occur during the course of the contract.

**OTHER BUSINESS**  
 In other business at its Aug. 17 meeting The Simcoe County Roman Catholic Separate School Board:

(a) heard a report from Board Chairman Mary Jo Quilty about preliminary discussions regarding the visit of His Holiness Pope John Paul II to Midland. She noted that the plan is for the local people to be the major participants.

(b) heard a report from Director of Education W.P. Bolger regarding

progress on construction of Father F.X. O'Reilly School in Tottenham which will be roofed in the next 10 days.

(c) heard a report from Director of Education W.P. Bolger regarding progress on the new Catholic Education Centre to the effect that the walls will be up within the week.

(d) heard a report from the Director of Education that a site for the new St. Joseph's High School had now been determined as 10 acres on Cundles Road East. He noted that an approach had been made to Vespra Township council for necessary zoning and severance arrangements.

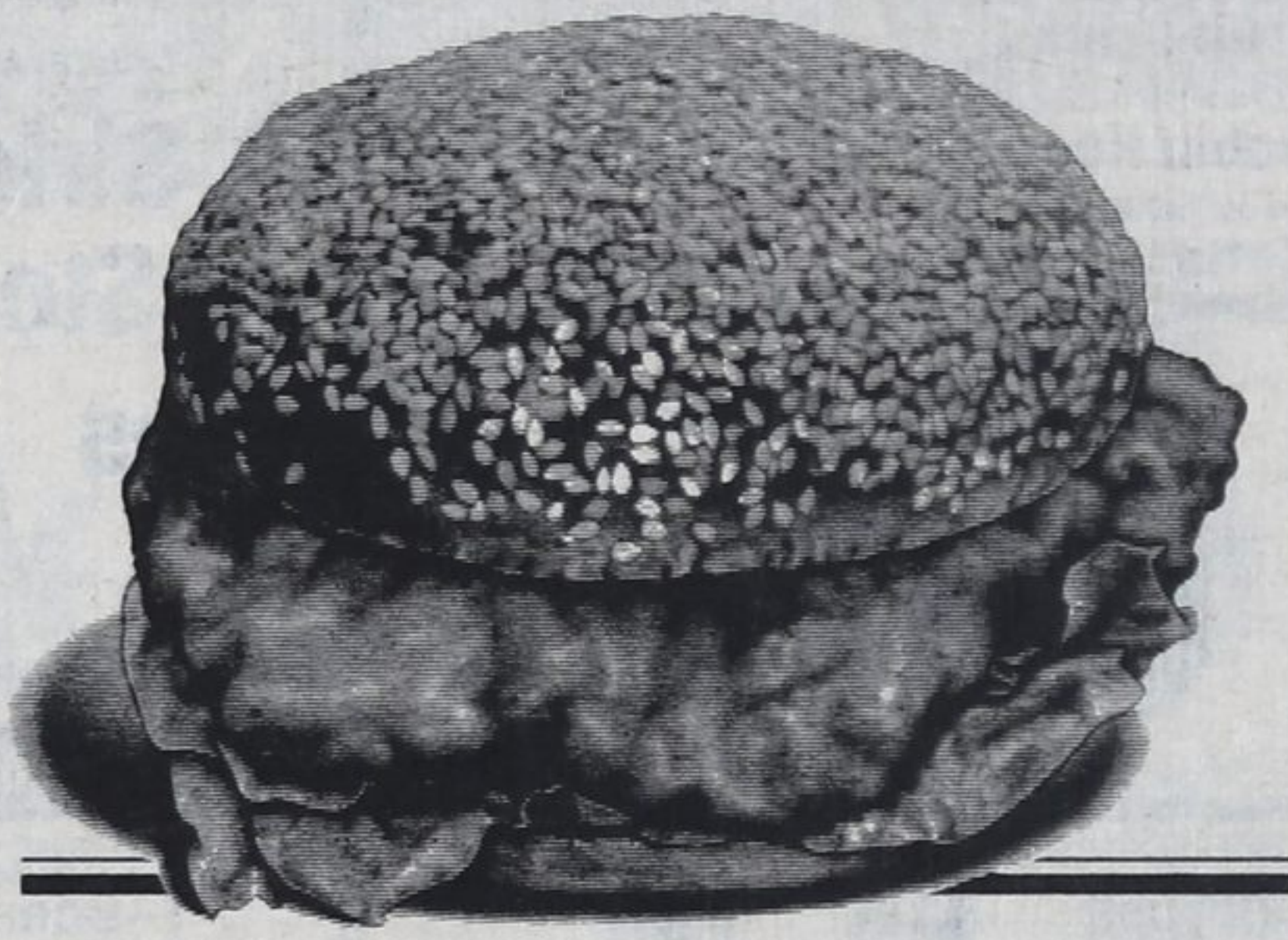
**PRE-PLANNING AND CHOOSING YOUR CEMETERY LOT**
