Penetang trailed the game 2-0 until the sixth inning when they knotted the score with a pair of tallies.

Deanne King led off with a single, stole second as Dale Butt struck out, and went to third on a passed ball. Meanwhile, Linda Ferraro walked and moved to second on the same passed ball.

With runners on second and third. another passed ball plated King, and Anne McNamara's single scored the other.

This was the first game of the best-of-five ODLFL semi-finals. The series now becomes a contest to see who can get six points first. Second game of the set is tonight in Orillia, although it Penetang's home game.


