In holding Orillia to just two runs, Pilon allowed just eight hits, walked only one, and struck out a pair. The only base on balls she allowed was intentional pass to Nancy Bell.

Bell, the opposing hurler, gave up just four hits, fanned seven, and walked two Penetang batters.

Penetang trailed the game 2-0 until the sixth inning when they knotted the score with a pair of tallies.

Deanne King led off with a single, stole second as Dale Butt struck out, and went to third on a passed ball. Meanwhile, Linda Ferraro walked and moved to second on the same passed ball.

With runners on second and third, another passed ball plated King, and Anne McNamara's single scored the other.

This was the first game of the best-of-five ODLFL semi-finals. The series now becomes a contest to see who can get six points first. Second game of the set is tonight in Orillia,

although it is Penetang's home game.

Last Thursday, in the final game of the opening round of the playoffs, Penetang used the long ball to swamp Orillia City Trucklines 16-8 to win that series five points to one.

Marilyn Morasse with two, Sandy Dubeau, Linda Ferraro, and Anne McNamara, also with two, hit homeruns to give R and R the win.
