



## Elmvale police report

An accident on August 16 in Wyevale resulted in minor injuries to one driver and his passenger. Injured were Joseph and Trila Rowntree of Elmvale. Their vehicle sustained \$2,000 damage when it collided with a vehicle driven by Robert Witty of Bradford, police say. Witty was charged with making an improper turn. Witty's car sustained \$3,000 damage.

Catherine Ritchie of RR 2, Elmvale was charged with careless driving following an incident on Aug. 17 on William Street. Police say her bicycle went onto the shoulder of the road and struck a parked car, causing a total of \$3,500 damage.

Charges of following to close were laid against Honore Lesperance of Conc. 11, Flos whose vehicle was involved in a collision with one driven by Susan Elliott of R. R. 1 Phelpston on Hwy. 92, west of Elmvale. No one was injured. Elliott's car sustained \$2,000 damage; Lesperance's, \$1,000 damage. The accident occurred on Aug. 19.

On August 20, an accident on Hwy. 93 north of C.R. 19 near Hillsdale resulted in \$1,200 total damage to two cars. Charged with making a U-turn is Patricia Romano of Mississauga, whose vehicle hit one driven by Steven Thompson of Hillsdale as she pulled out from a parked position and attempted the turn, police say.

## Housing Authority gets a new addition

### Wasaga Beach businessman added to important team

Thomas A. Hutchesson of Wasaga Beach has been appointed to the North Simcoe and Orillia Housing Authority, Municipal Affairs and Housing Minister Claude Bennett announced today.

Hutchesson, of T.A. Hutchesson & Associates, real estate appraisers, will serve as a federal representative on the eight-member authority which manages Ontario Housing Corporation's 701 assisted housing units in Collingwood, Elmvale, Midland, Orillia, Penetanguishene, Stayner and Wasaga Beach.

The federal, provincial and municipal governments nominate individuals for appointment to the housing authorities by provincial orders-in-council. The province appoints the housing authority chairman.

The day-to-day management of all of OHC's 94,000 housing units is carried out by local housing authorities, although the primary responsibility for assisted housing remains with OHC.

OHC chairman Allan Moses said: "By volunteering their time to serve on the local housing authority, private citizens such as Hutchesson are

helping to ensure that Ontario's assisted housing program is sensitive and can respond to the needs of the many communities it serves."

The North Simcoe and Orillia Housing Authority manages 501 senior citizen assisted housing units and 200 units for low-income families. The authority also provides housing for physically-disabled and mentally-retarded persons who are capable of living on their own.
