

Three Midland Y Keego swimmers will be leaving on Sunday Aug. 28 for Sudbury to participate in the Ontario Summer Games.


Andre Bourrie, Tim Bourrie and Lise Magnan were chosen as members of the Huronia Team based on their performances at the Huronia Regional Championships.
