Players are asked to bring all their own equipment to the practice.

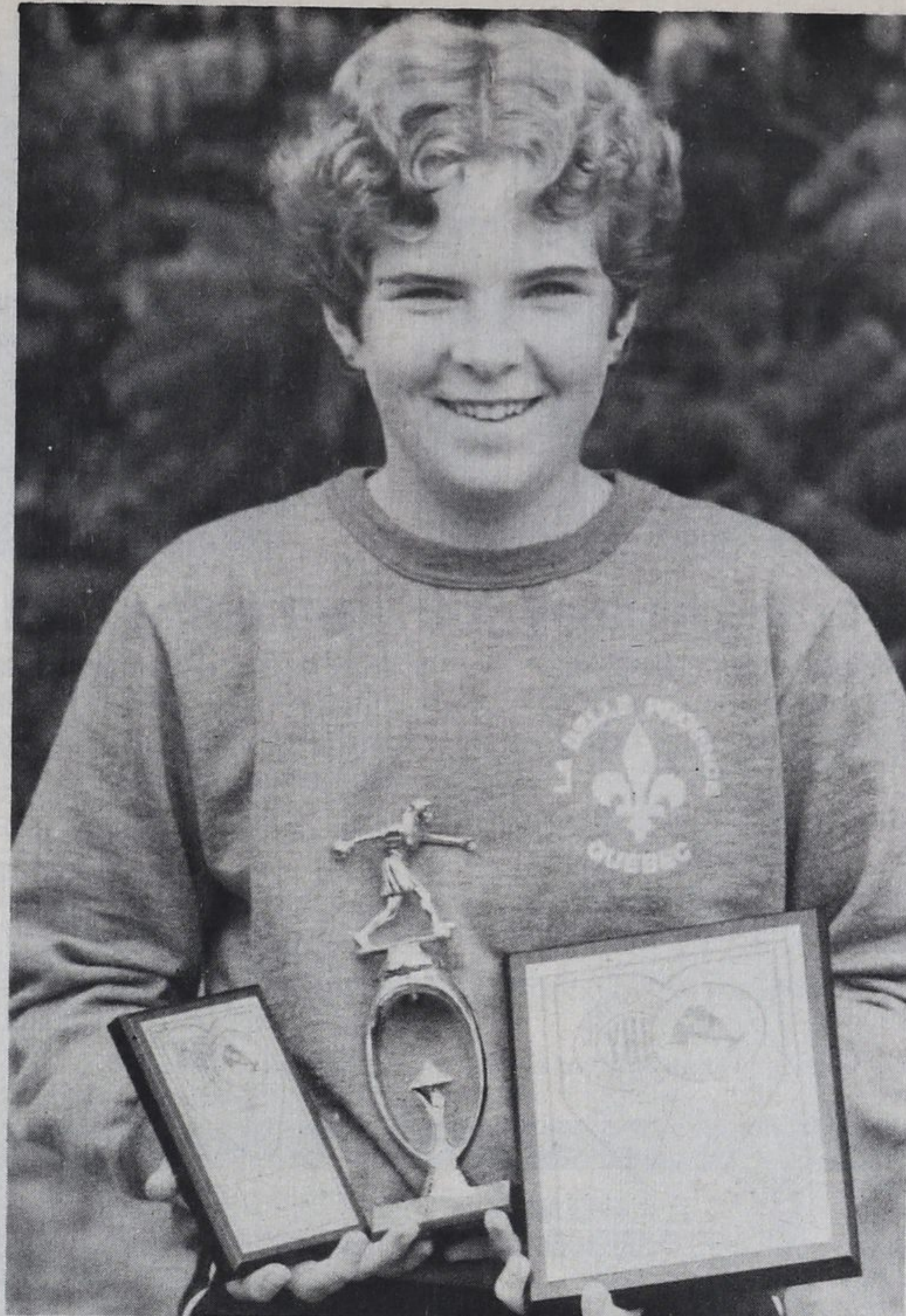
