### Hit & Run The Jimmy Hendrix Story by Jerry Hopkins

Thirteen years since the death of Jimi Hendrix, he is still remembered as a musician in a class by himself. He redefined the spectrum of the electric guitar, making sounds no one since has been able to duplicate or explain, even with the advanced electronic technology developed since his death.

From his bleak childhood in an impoverished, motherless home in Seattle, Hendrix rose to become a superstar in the musically rich 60's. His brilliant guitar work speaks for itself. The story of his life at the top, his nonstop consumption of drugs and groupies, with a supporting cast of famous rock stars, has been told by Jerry Hopkins, who has written two biographies of Elvis, a biography of Jim Morrison of the Doors and other books about the hippie generation.

Hopkins book is not a literary triumph, but is an absorbing chronicle of 60's music which would interest lovers of rock and roll. The book leaves the reader wondering what would have become of Hendrix if he had survived until now, which would have been his 40th year. Would he have gone on to greater heights of electifying "Foxy Lady" and "Purple Haze" to an ageing, bored crowd?

For the hedonistic Hendrix, the latter fate might have been even more dismal than his depressing end, an overdose of barbiturates and alcohol, at the age of 27.

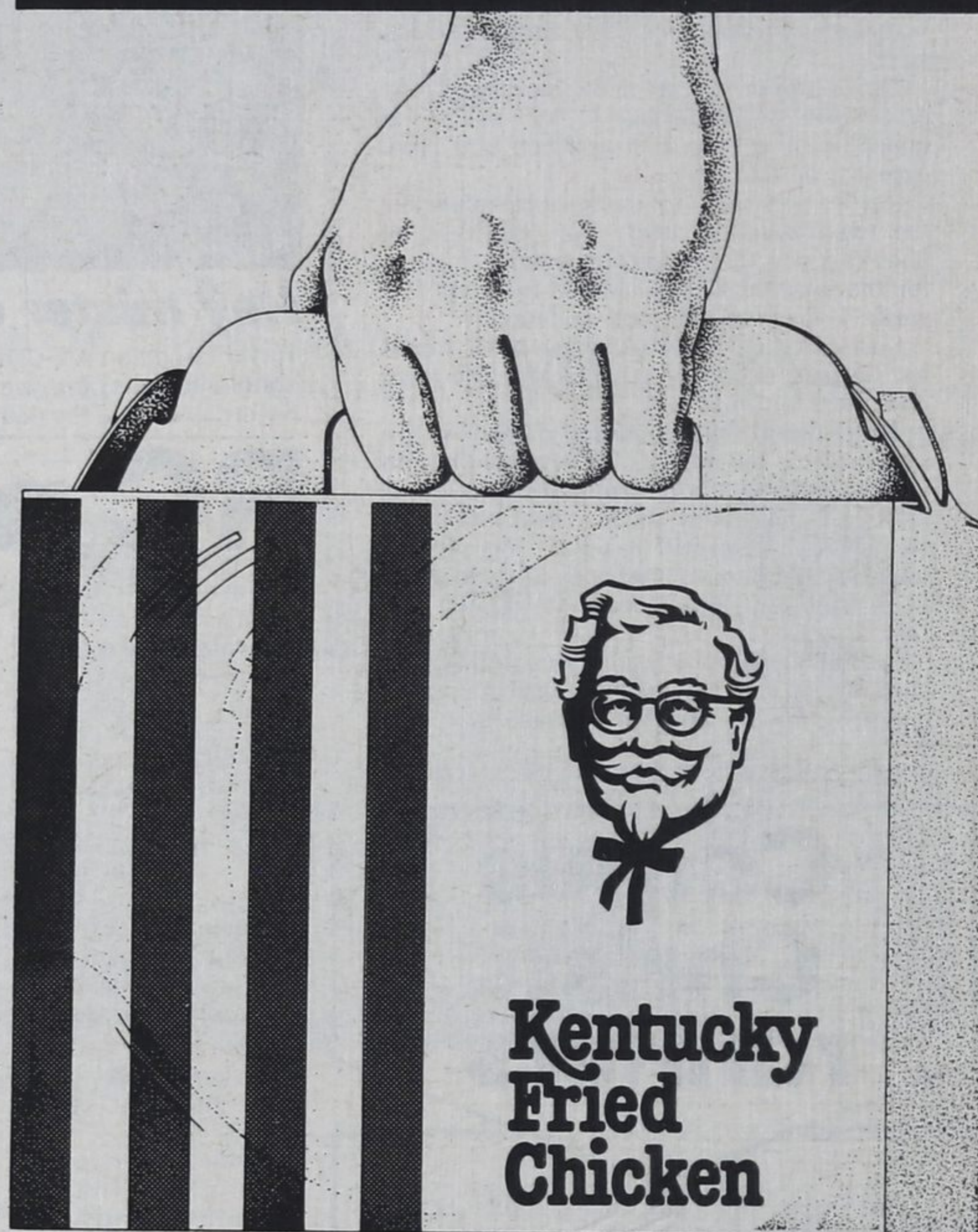
