Kari Simpson would like to express her gratitude to the Fall

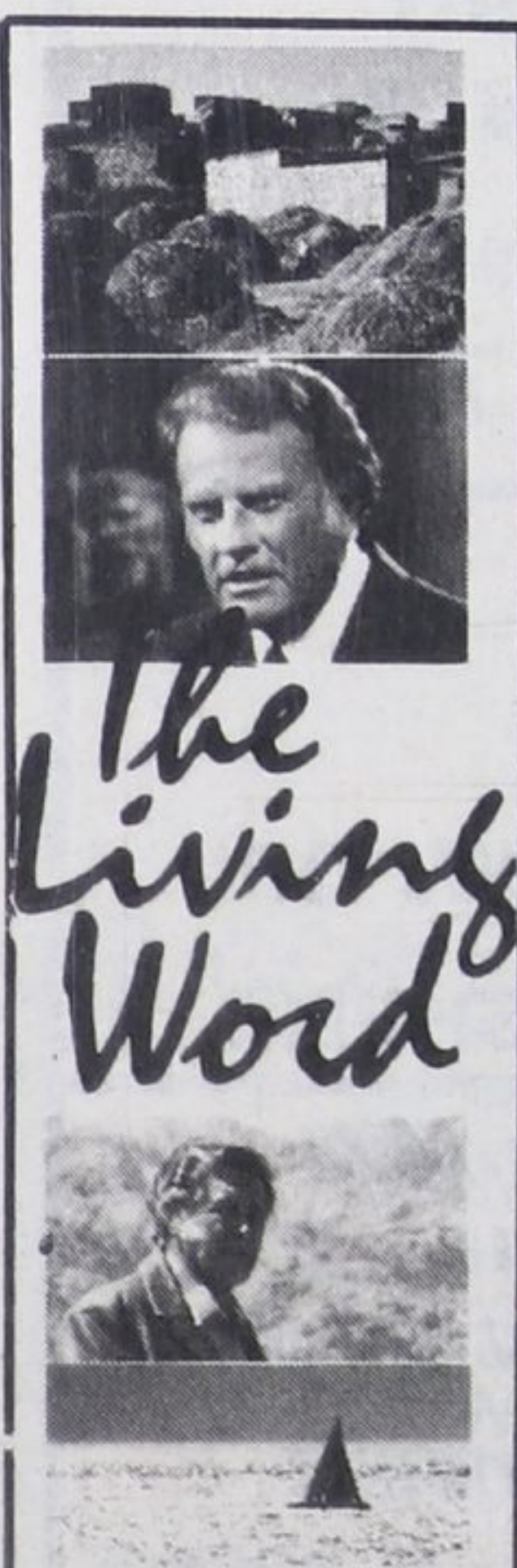

Articles entered in the Domestic Needlecraft competition must be submitted on Wednesday, Oct. 5. Quilts, afghans and rugs, accessories, for living and dining room, kitchen, bedroom, clothing and special categories will be judged in this section.
