In these days when the Royal House of Windsor, Britain's Royalty, is reaching new heights of popularity and visibility, this book, Elizabeth R - A Biography by Elizabeth Longford, is a must for fans and followers.

In contrast to the sensational and exploitive attention given to Charles and Di and Andrew and Koo, Lady Longford's biography of the Queen is a down-to-earth, realistic portrait of Elizabeth from her childhood to the present.

It is full of descriptions and stories that deal with the Queen's personality and attitudes.

Longford stresses our Monarch's class, regal carriage, and seemingly endless composure in the face of imminent danger, unusual circumstances, and changing social situations.

In the beginning, Lady Longford relates the stories of the "shooting incident" during the 1981 Trooping of the Colours Birthday Parade, and the palace intruder; Michael Fagan, in May of 1982.

In both cases, Queen Elizabeth showed unerring courage and calm in the face of calamity.

It is this combination of the Queen's cool courage and her desire to be a monarch of the people, that have molded her long reign, and therefore form the basis of Longford's book.

Elizabeth R is an excellent descriptive and illustrative bio of the Commonwealth's real "superstar".

You'll enjoy reading about how the "other half" lives, and the 32-page picture section is most appealing.

The Favorite - moving and memorable

The first half of "The Favorite" reads like an ordinary romantic novel, more skilfully written than most, but otherwise unremarkable.

Boy-meets-girl and family scenes are described in long flashbacks until the reader begins to wonder if the author will ever get to the present, or to the point. In part three, however, this pleasant story of a warm father and daughter relationship becomes charged with drama when the girl, named Sarah, discovers her own sexuality. Her father is

unable to overcome his jealousy as he watches his favorite daughter turn to a boy her own age for affection. The death of the father leaves the family reeling, each struggling with unresolved conflict and emotion. The way Sarah comes to terms with her troubled memories of her father is told with deep insight and sensitivity, and the conflicts of her sister and mother are explored and resolved in a most satisfying way.

L. R. Wright's "The Favorite", is a moving and memorable book about family relationships.
