Mrs. Jean Margison of Elmvale, spent a year in Australia when her husband exchanged their home and his work here in Canada to go "down-under" as an exchange teacher. Their

experiences, during 1982, when they worked and travelled throughout the southern part of that far-away land, were interesting, informative and a delight to hear.

Colour slides were used to illustrate the typical Australian home with the tin roof, the wide, deep veranda and the large tank, looking something like the silos seen on our farms here in Ontario, used to catch the rain water. We saw the red soil of the countryside, the high hills with the beautiful colour changes on the rugged rocks, the shearing of the sheep, the magnificent gum tree by the river, the petrified forest on the Victoria Coast, the Great Ocean Road on the Melbourne coastline, the pelicans, kangaroos, cockatoos, koalas and many lovely coral formations. With the Margisons we travelled the barren and lonely road across the country to Perth, we picked oranges with Jean in winter and in summer, we walked on the miles of clean, sandy beaches and went hang-gliding with Alan. Margaret Hood put into words the thoughts of the audience when she expressed appreciation and thanked Mrs. Margison for sharing with us her memories and pleasures of that wonderful year in Australia.
