

# Cent's lose 6-5 squeaker to Haliburton

Midland Stoneleigh Centennials suffered their second straight loss, at the hands of the Haliburton Huskies, Friday night, at Centennial arena.

Despite a large crowd, Cents' could not get the equalizer and the eventual outcome was a 6-5 victory for the visiting Huskies.

Haliburton opened the scoring at the :37 mark, with an unassisted goal by David Nicholl, his first of four that he scored. Midland tied the score at 11:43, on a power-play goal by Brian Cadeau, with Rob Rinneard and Dean Marcellus nabbing

assists. Four minutes later, Nicholls scored his second of the game, which also was a powerplay goal. John Walter scored his first, of three, to tie the score, at 18:18. Mike Newhouse drew the assist. Cents' outshot Haliburton in the period 12-5.

The second period made the difference for Haliburton. At 11:32, Scott Arbutnot scored, to give the Huskies the lead. Midland replied three minutes later, on Walter's second goal of the night. Then, at 17:07, Haliburton's Jeff Stamp scored a short-handed tally, which seemed to have taken the wind out of the Centennials' sails. Shots on goal in the second frame were 11-10, in favour of Midland.

Walter rounded out his hat-trick at the :26 mark of the third period, to tie the score at four. Peter Wright assisted. Nicholls collected his hat-trick minutes later, to give the Huskies the lead once again. Midland again tied the score at 5:31 on a goal by Mike Newhouse, with Walter assisting. However, Nicholls was not finished. At 14:01, he fired home his fourth goal of the night, to seal away the Haliburton victory.

Midland pulled their goalie in the final minutes, in a vain attempt to tie the score, but failed to do so. Huskies' goalkeeper, Colin Newell played an exceptional game between the pipes, especially in the third period, when the Cents' fired 17 shots his way, to Haliburton's seven. Total shots were 40-22 in Midland's favour.

John Walter was selected as the first Midland Stoneleigh Centennial "player of the game." Walter scored three times and assisted on another.

## Late goal gives Centennials' tie

A late third period goal by Marlon Gieseler, gave the Midland Stoneleigh Centennials a 4-4 tie, with the Stayner Siskins, in Stayner Monday night.

Midland opened the scoring at the 3:47 mark on a power-play goal by Darryl Belcourt, with Chris Readman and Mike Newhouse assisting. Cents' outshot the Stayner 10-8.

Stayner exploded in the second frame, with three goals in the first 12 minutes of the period. Cents' got one back at 13:06, to close the margin to 3-2. Mike Magloughlin scored the

goal, with Belcourt and Rob Rinneard assisting. Stayner outshot the Cents' 12-5 in the second stanza.

Stayner took a 4-2 lead at the 12:04 mark, but the Cents' pressed the Siskins. At 16:26, Belcourt scored his second goal of the game and third point, to bring the Centennials to within one. Peter Wright and Jeff Hurl drew the assists. Then Giesler performed his last minute heroics, at the 18:15 mark, to tie up the game. Wright assisted on the goal.

Midland outshot Stayner 12-11, but were outshot in the game 31-27.
