



# Fox Street sewer will be extended *the work is expected to cost \$226,000*

More sanitary sewer pipe will be laid under Penetanguishene's Fox Street, perhaps this year. Only two owners of property along the affected stretch of Fox Street objected. The work is expected to cost \$226,000.

Any more laying of pipe this year will have to stop at Broad Street. The steep slope down to the water from Broad Street will have to be

surveyed. Earlier in the year a pumping station was built, and sanitary sewer pipe laid under Fox Street, at a cost of \$630,000.

On Monday, during a special council meeting, zoning of seven lots in the Therrien subdivision was changed to residential from agricultural.

The council also dealt with the rezoning of the Dock Lunch property, and the zoning of land for a playground on Dufferin Street.

Councillor Larry Bellisle has been appointed to represent the town on a committee formed to investigate creating a system of transportation for the area's physically

handicapped.

The Mental Health Centre is going to ask Penetanguishene to provide fire service for its Oak Ridge division. Oak Ridge, unlike the rest of the MHC, is located in neighbouring Tay Township. The Midland Fire Department is responsible for Oak Ridge, acting for the township.

Heading up the official opening was Canada Post President, Michael Warren, who says that he expects Santa will receive more than a million letters this year. Last year, 500,000 letters were answered with the help of 4,000 postal employees and volunteers from the community.

Children should write Santa c/o North Pole, Canada using the postal code HOH OHO. Canada Post President, Michael Warren says that every child who writes a letter and includes a return address will receive a reply.
