Mina Parnell, born Mina Veals, on a farm near Omemee, Dec. 2, 1880, was one of six children.

She spent the first 25 years of her life in this area before moving to Wyevale in 1905, the year she married Thomas Parnell.

They soon found themselves raising four

daughters on their farm on the sixth concession of Tiny Township. Farming, at the time, consisted of growing hay, grains, corn and turnips to feed the horses, cattle and poultry through the winter. Mina tended a large garden each summer to provide vegetables for winter

Strawberries and raspberries were also grown and preserved in quart and half gallon jars for family desserts. Mina occasionally sold strawberries for five cents a box. A goodsized orchard could also be found on the farm as well as maple trees which vielded half

gallon jars of winter sweetener. Mina made butter using a hand churn, but often had lots of help from the children.

To give you an idea of how life was in these earlier times, we heard an amusing story about Mina. She and a friend drove Mina's eight month old daughter to Midland in a horse and buggy in the month of September to have the child's photo taken.
