Tiny council briefs

Council supports Lafontaine Seniors
Township of Tiny council received a letter of thanks from Mrs. Helene Desroches, treasurer of Lafontaine Senior Citizens, Club D'Age D'Or, for Council's grant of \$500 to the club.

Clerk-administrator
Guy Maurice explained that the township already contributes funds to cover 20 percent of the operating costs of seniors clubs in Woodland Beach and Balm Beach, and felt a single grant to aid the Lafontaine seniors would be appropriate.

In the past, Council has approved a number of smaller grants of funds to the Lafontaine club in response to specific requests.
