At this point tournament rules gave the victory to Oshawa since they scored the first goal of the game. Oshawa advance to the Consolation Championship on the bye.

In Championship action Midland Majors defeated Collingwood, Oshawa Canadiens defeated Streetsville and Gravenhurst defeated Richmond Hill 3-2 in sudden-death overtime.

On the Bye, Gravenhurst advanced to the championship game.

In the Consolation semi-finals Penetang Minors defeated Downsview 5-1 on a strong performance by Jim Mason.

The championship semi-finals saw Midland Majors defeat a very stubborn Oshawa Canadiens team 2-1.

Untimely penalties and questionable coaching conduct contributed to Oshawa's loss.

In the Consolation finals a large local crowd watched

Three minutes into the sudden-death overtime Tim Mason scored the winner and brought Penetang its first championship of any type in six years.
