A total of 81 general occurrences were investigated by the Midland detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police during the week ending, May 14, reports OPP Const. Murray Cooper, the detachment's community services officer.

Four thefts, two cases of shop-lifting, seven wilful damage occurrences, one assault and two break-ins, head the list of crimes Midland OPP probed during the period May 7-14.

Impaired drivers drew the special attention of our OPP during this past week.

In all, a total of four drivers were charged with being impaired, OPP records show.

Traffic accidents have been on the rise in North Simcoe in recent weeks.

From May 7-14, OPP detachment personnel investigated no fewer than 11 motor-vehicle accidents on area highways.

Four of the mishaps were listed as "nonreportable" in that none of the crashes resulted in more than \$400 damage.

However, three people suffered injuries as a result of being involved in several of the collisions and were rushed to local hospital for treatment.

Oliver Dominic Yue, 23, of Sudbury will appear in Penetanguishene Provincial Court, June 7, to face two charges - failing to stop and criminal negligence operation of a motor-vehicle as a result of an incident early Sunday evening (6:41 p.m.) on Highway 69.

An OPP officer is said to have observed a southbound vehicle near Port Severn operating in an erratic manner.

The officer attempted to stop the auto in question but was unable to do so until the wanted vehicle was finally stopped on Highway 400 near County Road 19 (Moonstone).

OPP advise several charges were laid against a Penetanguishene man following a two-car collision on Hwy. 93, Friday evening.

Police report, a vehicle operated by Stanley Marion, 19, of Poyntz Street, was northbound Highway 93 at approximately 6:13 p.m. when his vehicle crossed the roadway to west shoulder coming into collision with '76 Chevrolet operated by Karen MacSpurren, 38, of Con. 10, Waubaushene.

Marion's vehicle entered the east ditch, striking a culvert, several lawns and shrubbery.

Marion was charged with criminal negligence, impaired driving excess alcohol, driving under suspension and fail to wear seatbelt.

Midland OPP have charged a Peel Street, Penetanguishene, resident with several charges following a pursuit and an accident south end of King Street late Sunday evening.

OPP report after charging a driver, 39, with careless driving the subject drove off erratically, through town streets and was finally involved in a collision at the south end of King Street.

The accused fled on foot in the Wye Marsh area. He finally surrendered to police and has been charged with dangerous driving, failing to stop for police in addition to original careless driving offence.
