Here's a neat way to earn badges

Girl Guides and Boy Scouts across Ontario will be beautifying streams, parks and beaches this year as part of their bicentennial environment program to earn ecology merit badges.

At a Queen's Park ceremony today, Environment Minister Andy Brandt presented representatives of the Girl Guides and Boy Scouts of Ontario with framed bicentennial ecology crests.

The crests are symbolic of 215,000 badges that will be awarded to scouts and guides involved in the environmental program. Mr. Brandt also

gave two bicentennial flags to Girl Guide Nell-Marie Abela and Boy Scout, Duane Chung in recognition of the organizations' participation in a bicentennial program to present these flags to the Girl Guides and Boy Scouts and I'm especially happy to have the ecology program a part of the bicentennial activities because it involves the youth of Ontario," said Mr. Brandt. He made the presentation on behalf of Margaret Birch, Chairperson of the Cabinet Committee on the bicentennial.

Girl Guide commissioner Mary O'Brien will award 115,000 badges to guides while Boy Scout commissioner Everett McCrimmon will present 100,000 badges to scouts participating in the program.

Environment Ontario is also distributing bicentennial ecology badges to the uniformed members of organizations such as the St. John Ambulance Corp. and some government agencies.

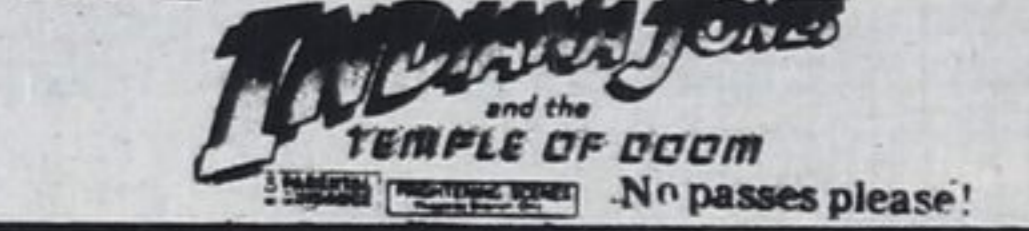
