The boundaries for this derby is any fish caught, using legal means with conventional hook and line only, in the waters of Georgian Bay, will be eligible.

Hindson Marine Islanders. Brian McReynolds with two, Peter Roi and Blair McReynolds with one each lead the Optical attack.

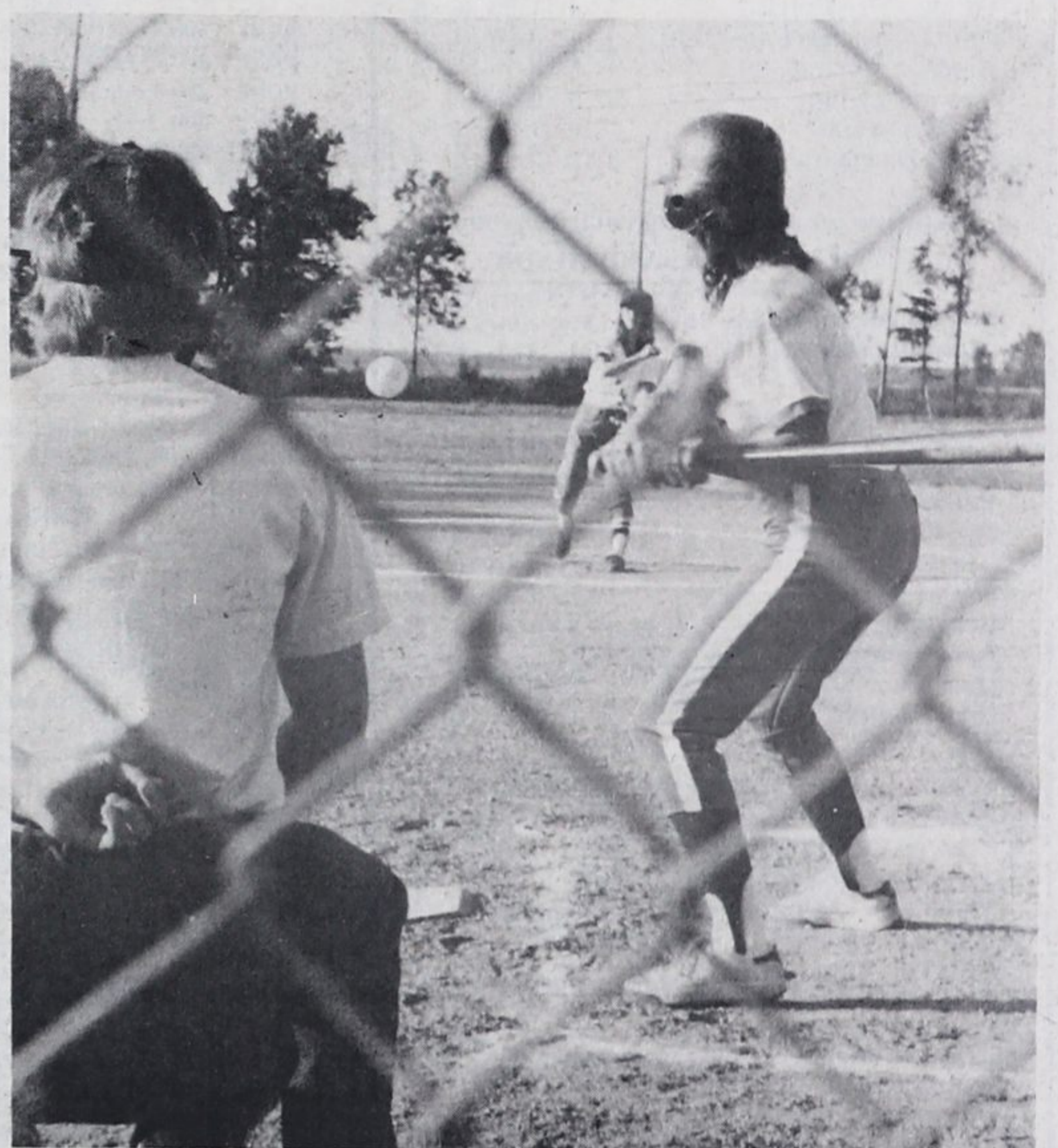
Chris McConnell scored the Islanders lone goal.
