to attend. Anyone wishing to start a new team, if an opening occurs, are also welcome to attend.

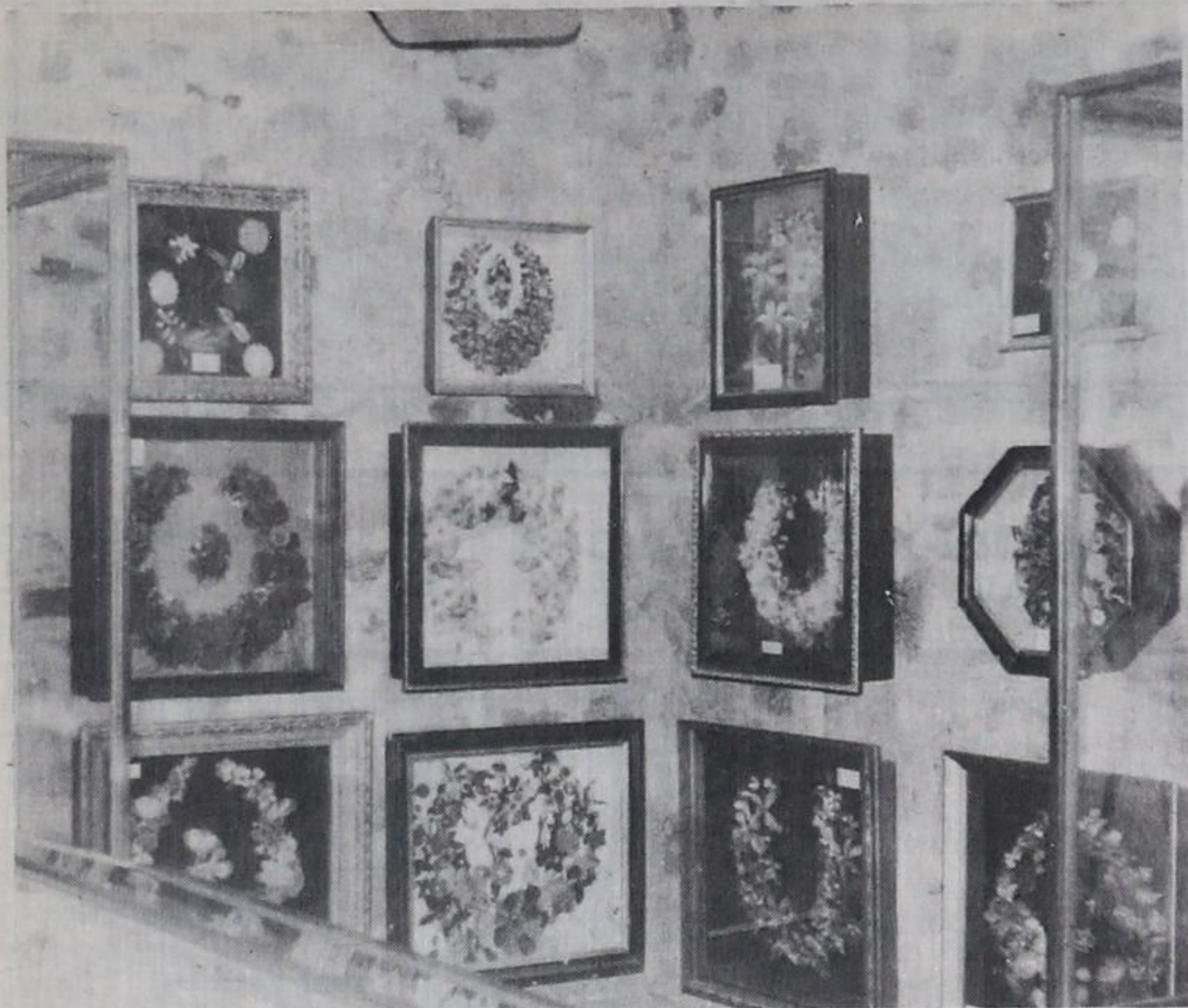
