

# Cardinal to say mass this evening at Shrine



His Eminence G. Emmett Cardinal Carter will celebrate an outdoor Mass at the Martyrs' Shrine this evening at 7:30 p.m.

Aug. 15 on the Liturgical calendar is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary, the Mother of Jesus.

This year it also marks one month to the day that Pope John Paul II will be at the Martyrs' Shrine as part of his visit to the Archdiocese of Toronto, Sept. 14-16.

The general public is being cordially invited to attend this evening's mass.

A media day is being held today at Martyrs' Shrine for journalists and broadcasters.

The day is being set aside to give the media photo opportunities and a chance to meet with the various chairmen connected with the Papal Visit to Huronia Committee.

At 4 p.m. the media will meet with committee chairmen, at 5 p.m. they have a chance to meet His Eminence G. Emmett Cardinal Carter and later attend a 6 p.m. reception.

At 7:30 p.m. Cardinal Carter will conduct mass at an outdoor altar. He'll also deliver the homily.

According to Doug Reed, chairman of the media-communications committee, the day promises to be an exciting one.

"I believe I can speak for our media committee when I say, we are not only ready for today's gala event but for Pope John Paul's visit to Huronia on Saturday, Sept. 15."

According to Reed, there are about two dozen committees related to the planning of the Holy Father's visit to Huronia, "And I get the feeling most committee members feel the way we do. We are ready."

"There will be lots of parking. Lots of room to see the Pontiff and it is going to be a once-in-a-life-time event no one should miss. Yes sir...we are ready."

## Free clinic held at Legion

For the fourth year in a row, residents of Penetanguishene have taken advantage of a free hearing test clinic set up at the Penetang Canadian Legion on Simcoe Street. On Tuesday, Provincial Hearing Consultants, a Stoney Creek, Ont. based company, set up testing equipment in the Legion. Martin Heinrich reported late Monday afternoon that at that time, about 25 people had been in to have their hearing tested. He commented that people are not as reluctant to get tested for possible hearing impairment if they do not have to make an appointment and travel to get it done.

## Suggestion of 'going public' will be his practice: reeve

Midland Reeve Bev Day said he will carry through to "go public" on matters of municipal business about which he feels the taxpayers should be informed.

Early during Monday's council meeting the reeve was critical of the number of bills filed for payment with the town for meals in restaurants, without identification, and of the number of long distance telephone calls. "I see we're back into the restaurant business again," he said.

In the reeve's absence, at the end of the meeting, Alderman Ian Ross referred to the reeve's announcement that he was going to "get us".

The reeve left the meeting during an argument about the treasurer which involved most of the council.

Alderman Ross said the reeve's departure was not his first from a council meeting, "not the first time" the reeve "has left in a huff." Ross said the reeve's leaving was unfair to the people who voted for him and that he was not making a contribution in

his absence.

Alderman Dan Herbert gave, as an example to be followed, the Olympic athletes who for the past two weeks fought on to win despite the odds. The athletes did not quit just because they did not win, or came second, Herbert said.

Mayor Roach, who earlier in the meeting supported Day, said it was unfortunate that Day was not present to respond. Another member of council, apparently agreeing with Ross, said that it was unfortunate that Day was absent.

Alderman Robert Jeffery asked the mayor to apologize to the other municipal employees for saying that treasurer Morrison is the object of a conspiracy because Morrison "does not bend down and drink from the same trough." The mayor did not respond.

Yesterday the reeve said he agreed he should have stayed, explaining that he left because he was frustrated.

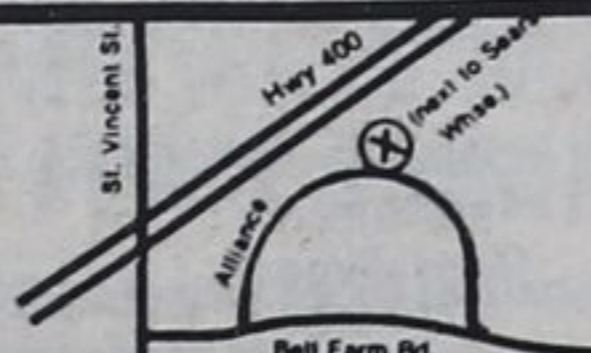
