The 233 Ontario athletes who competed in the Summer Olympics in Los Angeles are being invited to the celebration on the front grounds of Queen's

Park. Each will be introduced by Bob Secord, assistant deputy minister. Mr. Baetz and Premier William Davis will address the audience.

A male and female athlete, selected from the 44 Ontario athletes who returned from the Games with medals, including six individual gold and one team gold, will also speak.

The tribute begins at 11:30 a.m. with music from a band of the Royal Canadian Regiment. Introduction of the athletes, plus the


