Resorts here cost more to build than U.S.: study

A recently completed study by four Georgian College Tourism Management students indicates that building a resort lodge in the Muskoka's in 1984 costs 20 percent more than building a similar facility in the Catskills resort area of New York State.

Project Manager Barbara Sullivan of Rexton, New Brunswick, and Research Assistants Bob Hie of Gravenhurst, Bill Duffin of Collingwood, and Ingrid Peitsch of Huntsville, spent their summer co-op work term conducting extensive research for the project under the of Paul direction teaching

Purpose of the study was to prepare a comprehensive analysis of the capital cost for developing a resort property in Muskoka compared to developing similar property in the Catskills, a popular U.S. tourist destination.

In conducting their research, the team visited 28 resort lodges in Muskoka, and eight destination resorts in New York State. They determined the factors affecting development and related costs including land, hydro and sewer connection, construction materials and labour.

The price of land was discovered to be a

significant factor. One hundred acres of land (an average purchase) in Muskoka costs 44 percent more than the same acreage in the


