PETITION

We, the voting taxpayer citizens of Simcoe County hereby petition the Education Ministry of Ontario and the Simcoe County Board of Education as follows-

- (1) that in view of declining enrollments and the already low pupil / teacher ration, education tax rates be held at their present levels, and steps taken to lowering them. This means that the Board should immediately begin learning to live within its means and not have expectations of yearly tax increases.
- (2) that beginning with the 1985 tax year, it be mandatory for the contributing municipalities to be represented at S.C.B.E. budget drafting sessions in order to advise as to the contributions these municipalities find compatible to their own financial capabilities. This would simply be an extension of the democratic process, and perhaps give municipal bodies incentive to act as tax collectors for the Board.
- (3) that as of January 1, 1985, a question and answer period of at least 45 minutes be set aside at the end of each open Board session so that the voting taxpayer citizens who pay for it all, may exercise their presumed right to natural justice by asking questions of either trustees or administrative personnel.
