Cents' coach, Ross McConnell pointed out, that team had improved vastly over the first two games of the season.

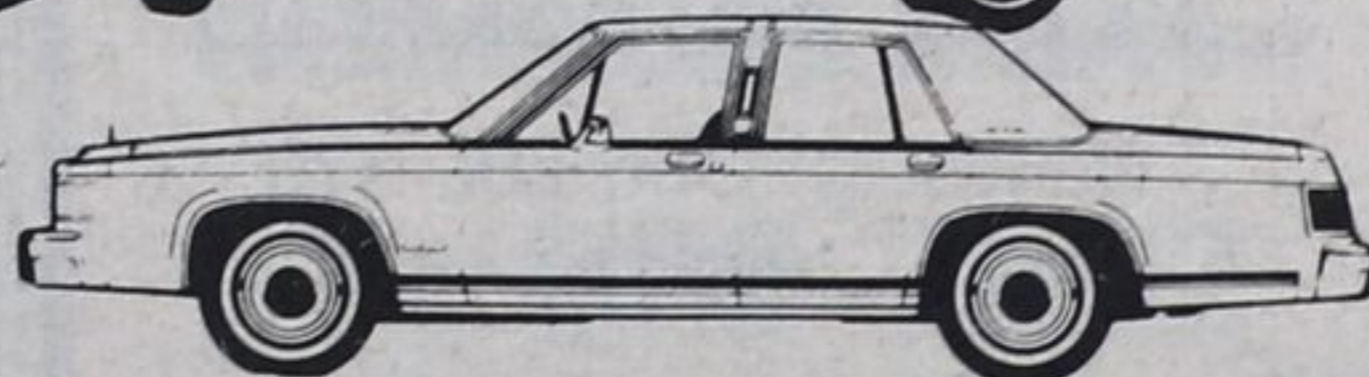
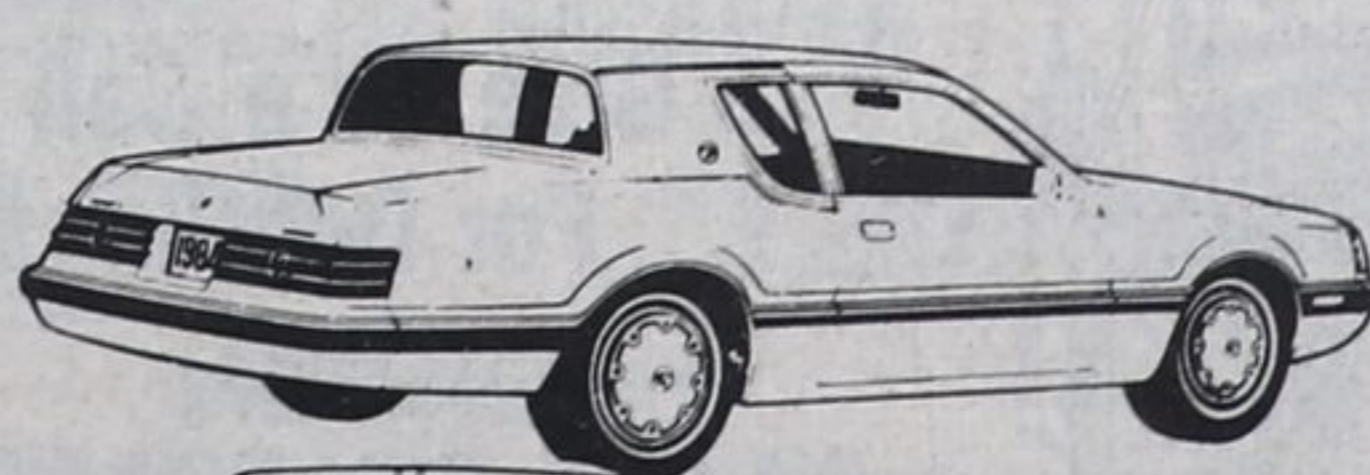
"One practice made a big difference," he said. McConnell believes his players are performing as a team now instead of as individuals.
