

The Prodigal

The Prodigal is an outstanding dramatic new movie from World Wide Pictures, the same film company which made Joni and The Hiding Place. One of the most familiar parables in the Bible is the story of the prodigal son. Writer-director James Collier has used the theme of this story as a springboard for a contemporary story about a modern-day prodigal son. More than this, his movie examines the members of an entire family, as each one searches for his or her identity in a world of conflicting values and changing

lifestyles.

The Prodigal examines the spiritual and emotional breakdown of the Stuart family, a well-to-do middle class American family who seem on the have surface to everything which life has to offer. But this is only on the surface. The channels of communication have been steadily eroding over the years to the point where this family's relationships with each other has absolutely deteriorated.

There is Elton Stuart, the head of the family. He is a hard-working insurance executive who has been so

preoccupied over his business throughout the years that he has spent little time with his wife and two sons. Elton Stuart has not neglected his family in any material sense, but he has been negligent in the area of developing close relationships with them. Anne Stuart, the wife

and mother, was formerly complacent when she had their two sons to raise. But now that the boys are grown up and not living at home, and her relationship with her husband has been somewhat neglected, she finds the time long and her life frustrating. She feels she has creative and intellectual potentials which have been untapped all her

Greg Stuart is the youngest son. At 21 he is still withdrawn from his family, unpredictable and rebellious. At the start of the movie we find that he has left the family and disappeared, and in effect has dropped out of society, in an attempt to find himself. When he does return to the family at the urging of his older brother he goes to the other extreme and pursues the fast life with its promises of money,

sex and power.

His brother Scott is quite a contrast. He is a first-year seminary student who lives in a snall apartment in a ghetto area. He is deeply concerned about social ills. Although Scott is more stable than Greg, he still causes his parents much worry and annyoance because of his lifestyle. Scott in turn is deeply troubled by the lack of communication in his family and particularly by the wayward path which his younger brother is following.

These are the people whose lives are so intimately probed in The Prodigal. And they are brought to life most vividly by a talented cast. The father is played by Broadway Tony-award winner John Callum. The mother is portrayed by Hope Lange, winner of two television Emmys.

John Hammond is outstanding as Greg, their prodigal son. Hammond is an up-andcoming young actor who made his movie debut last year in Cross Creek. The other brother Scott is well-played by Arliss Howard, who makes his movie debut in The Prodigal.

Members of the notable supporting cast include Morgan Brittany as the high fashion daughter of a tennis executive who introduces Greg to the fast life; Joey Travolta as a bad-news friend of Greg's who gets him involved in a dope smuggling enterprise; and Ian Bannen as an author who senses Hope Lange's emotional vulnerability.

The Prodigal is both an entertainment movie and a message movie, and it succeeds admirably on both levels.
