The custodian who discovered the unusual smell was partially


overcome by fumes and was taken to Huronia District Hospital for observation, on the advice of Midland Fire Chief Hal Belfry.

No problems were discovered and he was released later that day. Because the nature of


the chemicals were unknown, firefighters donned full protective gear to remove a cleaning bucket outside.


