now compete with a vengeance and skate more aggressively now that he placed second to Fedeev.

Orser who won the Skate Canada Competition and the silver medal at the Sarajevo Olympics was ranked first in the world after Scott Hamilton of the United States retired.

Janice, Brian's sister, said she feels that the pressure might have affected Brian's

performance. Now that Fedeev won the Tokyo meet the pressure will be on him and less on Brian in the next competition she added.

Grser was scheduled to have been back early Tuesday morning, but fog conditions at Toronto International Airport delayed his arrival making him unavailable for comment.
