Shrunken Tory Cabinet meets today

Simcoe East MPP Allan McLean meets Premier Frank Miller and the rest of the surviving members of the Ontario Cabinet today, for the first meeting of the Cabinet since the May 2 election.

McLean, chief government whip when the election was called, will have 20 fewer fellow Conservatives to direct when the Legislature resumes sitting on May 21.

On Monday, McLean noted that the Conservatives lasted from 1975 through 1981, a two year and a four year period of minority government. He does not expect the coming session to be different, if the parties work together. McLean does not foresee an election for at least one year. An earlier election will be because of the Liberals, he suggested.

THE RESULTS of last week's provincial election revealed in the ridings of Simcoe East and Simcoe Centre at least that the seven candidates didn't meet every voter's standards:

Thirty-eight voters in Simcoe East and 35 voters in Simcoe Centre last Thursday didn't think much of any of the candidates seeking elected office. These voters returned their ballot to the deputy returning officer of their polling station and indicated that they were declining to cast their vote.

In Simcoe East, 166 marked ballots were rejected by the deputy returning officers; in Simcoe Centre, 165.

In Simcoe East, 39 ballots emerged from the ballot boxes unmarked; in Simcoe Centre, 63.


