The three-week program will be held. from July 2 to July 19 at North Collegiate in Barrie from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

School busing will be provided for students from outside Barrie. Cost of the summer band program is \$100.

A beginning program will be offered for students who have never studied instrumental music before. This "headstart" program will provide private lessons from professional music teachers, performance in small ensembles and junior band classes.
