The Railway Transport Committee of the Canadian Transport Commission will be considering an application by the Canadian National Railway Company to abandon the operation of its Penetang Subdivision between North Colwell (Mile 2) and Hendrie, Ontario (Mile 11.85), a distance of 9.85 miles. The Committee will also determine whether a public hearing is required for this purpose.

This trackage has been closed to train operations since August, 1978, and there are no known active firms or industries that would require rail service there.

All persons who wish to comment on this application, or who believe that a public hearing is required on this matter, should make their views known to the Committee in writing, in English or French, on or before June 21, 1985, to John O'Hara, Secretary, Railway Transport Committee, Canadian Transport Commission, Ottawa, K1A 0N9.

If the Committee determines that no public hearing is required, it will make its decision on the application based on the material on file.
