

by SANDRA SADDY Available now at the Contact Information Centre: A Workbook on Equal Opportunity in Employment, published by the Ontario Human Rights Commission race relations division. A useful workbook helpful in making more effective use of human resources; focusing on race relations issues and other principles on the Ontario Human Rights Code. Summary principles identified in the Workbook are:

We are all subject to various forms of discriminatory treatment.

Racial discrimination is unacceptable.

Equal opportunity is a means of overcoming organizational barriers and discriminatory practices at the workplace. Equal opportunity

equals an effective management organizational function.

Selection must be based on job-related criteria.

Hire and or promote the most qualified candidate.

Termination should be based on an objective performance appraisal. Employees are en-

titled to continuous feedback as to what is expected of them. Take immediate

A seemingly action. harmless incident very quickly grows into something larger. Develop and im-

plement strategies for improving communications and promoting harmonious and ethnic relations at the work-

All employees have different needs which can be met through positive action.

In specific circumstances, the needs of certain groups may have to be met through special programs such as preferential hiring.

A effective equal opportunity program should: incorporate a positive plan of action, reflect issues and concerns of the workplace and the community, comply with the Ontario Human Right Code, be based on broad employee participation, not be unilaterally introduced, not be the sole responsibility of one individual (others lose Interest), be reviewed

and updated by appropriate workplace personnel. The Human Right Code is a usefule resource as well as the law. Use it to promote equal employment opportunity.


