Gail Redditt informs me that the N.S.W.M.A. has received authorization from the Ministry of the Environment. Mr. Ciulini to proceed with the Recycling Program. More about this later. This meeting will be held on Thursday, Aug. 29th at 10 a.m. at the Port McNicoll Municipal Office.

Council held their monthly open meeting last Tuesday (Aug. 20). John Rose and Bill Greystone of Paradise Point expressed their concern over the possibility of changes to the roadway on Silver Birch Cres. Reeve John Moreau informed them that all the other roads in Paradise Point will be paved this year. The exception, Silver Birch Cres., will have to await the solicitor's decision.

Tom Savage stated that a small tree at First and Simcoe obstructs the view of motorists.

Councillor Leo Copeland and Vic Kelly will check into this.

Mrs. Mary Campbell feels that the trail bikes being run on Wardell and Fourth are hazardous and extremely noisy. By-Law Enforcement Officer Omer Beausoleil will issue a warning. The next step will be a fine, then the possibility of a court action, as this goes against the Anti-Noise By-Law of the Village.

Building Permits to date are down from last year. Council is keeping a year-to-date record of this.

A total of \$56,785.56 in accounts were okayed for payment this month.

A By-Law was passed enabling the Village to borrow monies until taxes are paid. This is in case it is required.

There will be a request to go to the Ministry of the Environment for a meeting regarding the water, balance of sewers, etc.

The waste bin has been removed from Paradise Point. And a good thing, because it was quite an eyesore. The idea is sound; the use and placement wasn't.

ROSS CAMERON: The motorcycles at the hotel are presenting a few problems.

PAT ARMSTRONG: Report from N.S.W.M. shows the test holes at the Johnston farm have a suitable clay base. If the Pauze Site is full again on Sept. 19, 1987, it will close. The Ministry of the Environment says there will be no extension. It is highly unlikely

that a new site will be ready by 1987. However, the final decision will rest with the Government of Canada, the Ministry of the Environment. There will have to be an Environmental Assessment Hearing.
REGIS QUESNELLE: Teen Dances will start again on Sept. 19. Chaperones will be required so please let Parks and Recreation know of your availability soon.

Broomball for ages six to 14 will also be starting. Badminton will be available on Thursday evenings. The Tennis Court in Talbot Park will be ready shortly. The Parks and Recreation Board requires two new members. Anyone interested, please contact the Village Office.
