Month of August '85 has beaten the 30-year average for measurable precipitation in Huronia...

According to the North Bay Weather Office, Midland-Penetanguishene normally receives 10 days of rain during the 31 days of August.

However, this year, according to Midland's Mel Curtis who keeps such information, we had 14 days of wet weather.

Wiarton normally has 10 days of wet weather in August, Collingwood has eight, Owen Sound, 13 and Parry Sound, 11, weather office officials confirmed.

And you might be interested in knowing, according to information complied by Mr. Curtis, we had six days of measurable precipitation in February, seven in March, nine in April, 12 in May, eight in June and 10 in July.


