Recreation's in your future at Midland YMCA

The opportunity to explore a career in recreation management is coming soon to the YMCA, where one of every six Midlanders is a member: the highest ratio of community involvement for any Y across North America.

OCAP (Ontario Career Action Program) will be among the first priorities for new Program and Physical Director Brian Seabourn, who commenced his official duties on Wednesday.

The provincial Ministry of Colleges and

Universities program will give Seabourn three months to introduce one or more young people to his profession, without committing them to a full time job.

He plans to involve the successful applicant(s) in the supervision of a range of Y activities including the pre-school program, and the teen gym and swims. Seabourn, a Humber College Recreation Leadership graduate, says OCAP experience would be excellent preparation for anybody planning to enroll in a similar

course.

OCAP applicants must be between 16 and 24 years of age, out of school for at least three months, and currently unemployed. OCAP "trainees" receive a \$100 week training allowance, but previous OCAP "trainees" are ineligible for further assistance from the program.
