Environmental hearing some time in 1986

North Simcoe Waste Management Association is working on completing its report for the provincial government with the expectation that an environmental assessment hearing will begin some time in 1986.

Association chairman Lionel Dion said he is probably being optimistic in saying that a new dump will be approved by the deadline of fall of 1987.

First the Association's report must pass through the hands of more than one dozen government ministries before an environmental assessment hearing can begin. And a hearing "can go on for months."

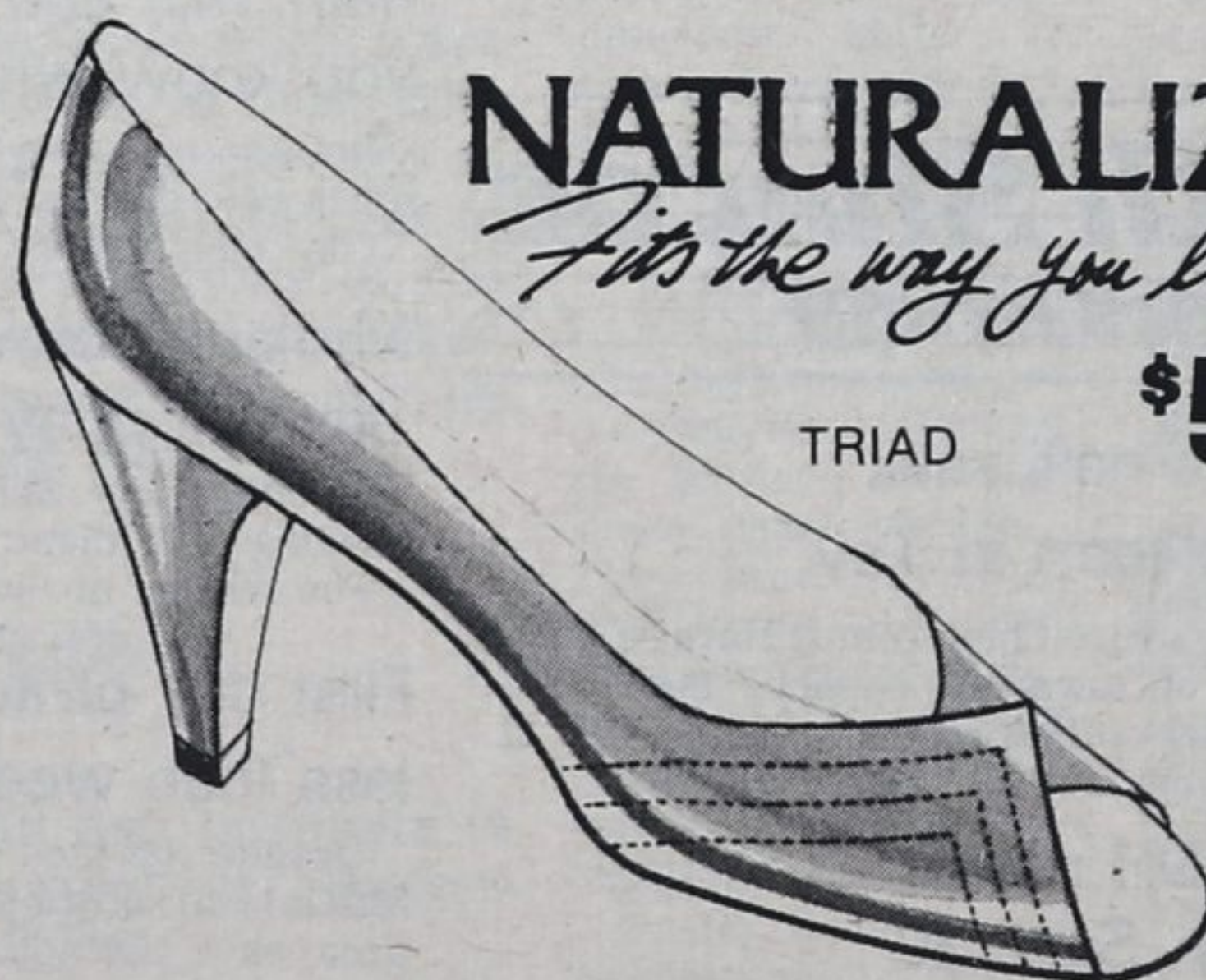

Some 400 attended Saturday's mass in the Shrine Church for the aged, sick and disabled.

"They were delighted at being asked to be part of this annual event."

Well in excess of 4,000 people attended Sunday's outdoor mass.

During the Holy Father's visit in 1984 an estimated 100,000 were on hand to see and hear the Pontiff during his six hour visit to Huronia (St. Marie and the Shrine).
