

Orr Lake man issues challenge

\$500 donation the prize

An Orr Lake man is issuing a challenge to local authorities. Charlie Shaw will donate \$500 towards the cost of a public swimming pool in Elmvale if it can be proven that the water supply of Elmvale and the waters of Orr Lake are not threatened by pollution from the proposed new dump site in the south end of Tiny Township.

Furthermore, he stipulates that the proof must come from a hydrogeological engineering firm other than Barker, Terp and Gibson, who work for the North Simcoe Waste Management Association. The NSWMA, on advice from Barker, Terp and Gibson, has decided to locate a new dump site on the farm of Wayne Johnston, Concession 2 of Tiny, just north of

Elmvale and Flos Township.

Shaw's concern over possible danger to surrounding water supplies is based on what he sees from the corner of the Orr Lake Road and the Flos Baseline. The Johnston property, he contends, is a basin for the whole area; if toxic material from a dump site there ever seeps into the ground water below, it would enter what he says is an underground aquifer affecting a wide area.

Shaw is upset over what he sees as a lack of concern among the Councils of municipalities which could be affected by possible pollution from the new dump. He includes Elmvale, Flos and Medonte in the list. His challenge is an attempt to draw attention to the issue. Shaw also warns

property owners in the area that they should be concerned about the possible effects of pollution on the value of their property. He points to parts of Perkinsfield, where some home owners are having difficulty getting mortgages or selling their homes near the polluted Pauze dump.

In this Saturday's municipal election, Shaw is endorsing William Harvey for Elmvale Council, because Harvey "is the only candidate who had the courage to (call for) a more careful evaluation of the potential threat to Elmvale's water supply from the proposed new dump site in Tiny."

Shaw would also like to see as many citizens as possible at the NSWMA's Open House in the Wyevale Public School November 23 from 2 to 4 p.m.
