THE WATERSHED: An epic offering from journalist Erin Pizzev (founder of Women's Aid, a British refuge house for battered wives). She dedicates this book to the "seven out of 10 married women" who have suffered the pain of having an unfaithful husband. Fictional heroine Rachel, raised by two maiden aunts, innocent until her husband's confession of infidelity drags her into the 20th century. There's lots that interests here, lots that rankles. In fact, it's four novels in one. Some heavy-handed editorializing about feminism is balanced by the true romance ending (Corgi, \$4.95).

ELEANOR, THE YEARS ALONE: At 61, her husband dead, Eleanor Roosevelt began a new life in which she was not the woman behind the man - she was a successful public figure in her own right. The humanitarian work she had accomplished as "Mrs. Roosevelt" flourished and her attempts at world peace, her recognition of the bully nature of the Soviet Union, her love for Americans made her a cherished political personage. Author Joseph P. Lash describes her friendship with Harry Truman, Adlai Stevenson and her unique role in the creation of the state of Israel in this biography which continues where his Pulitzer Prize-winning Eleanor and Franklin ended (Meridean, \$14.50).
