Huronian District logs first hunting accident: for the first time in its seven year history Huronia's controlled deer hunt was marred by a hunting accident.

Each year more than 2,000 hunters take part in a four-day deer hunt. Until this year no hunting accidents had been reported.

According to the Ontario Provincial Police, Elmvalle Detachment, on Nov. 5 at 6 a.m., Randy Garrett, a 30-year-old man from Barrie, received a shotgun wound to his right forearm.

He was treated in Barrie Hospital and released. According to Ministry of Natural Resources, 23 stitches were required to close the man's wound.

Mario Stefanin, a 49-year-old Brampton man, has been charged under the Fish and Game Act with careless hunting.

The incident occurred on Con. 1 of Medonte Township.
