McIsaac was the leader after the first round with 18 and three-quarter points, followed in second by Sharon Fenton of Orillia with 17 and one-quarter. McIsaac was unable to mount much of an offense against Fenton in round two and narrowly squeaked by with a 7-6 victory, not enough for first place.

Ten points were granted for a win, while one point was awarded for winning an end. If an end was blanked or tied, a half point was awarded, while a quarter point was awarded for total score up to a maximum of three. A tie game was broken by each player throwing one rock. There were two tiebreakers in the 'spiel.

Midland's Lee Rusch finished fifth out of the 10 rinks entered. Lorraine Moreau's Penetang foursome came in seventh. Charlotte Tully and Vivian Shaw, both of Midland, finished ninth and tenth, respectively.

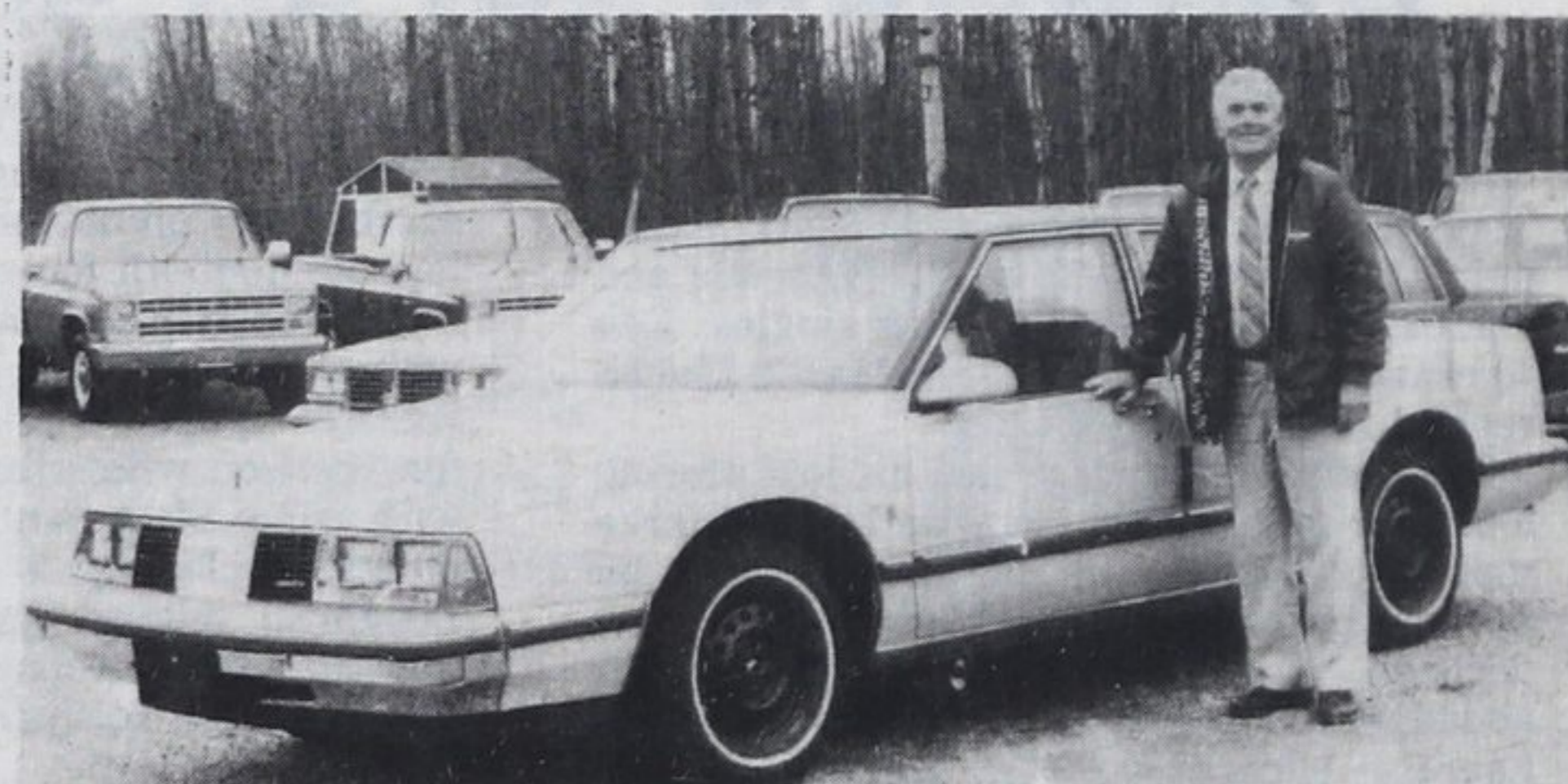
