### Kings explode for 10-2 triumph

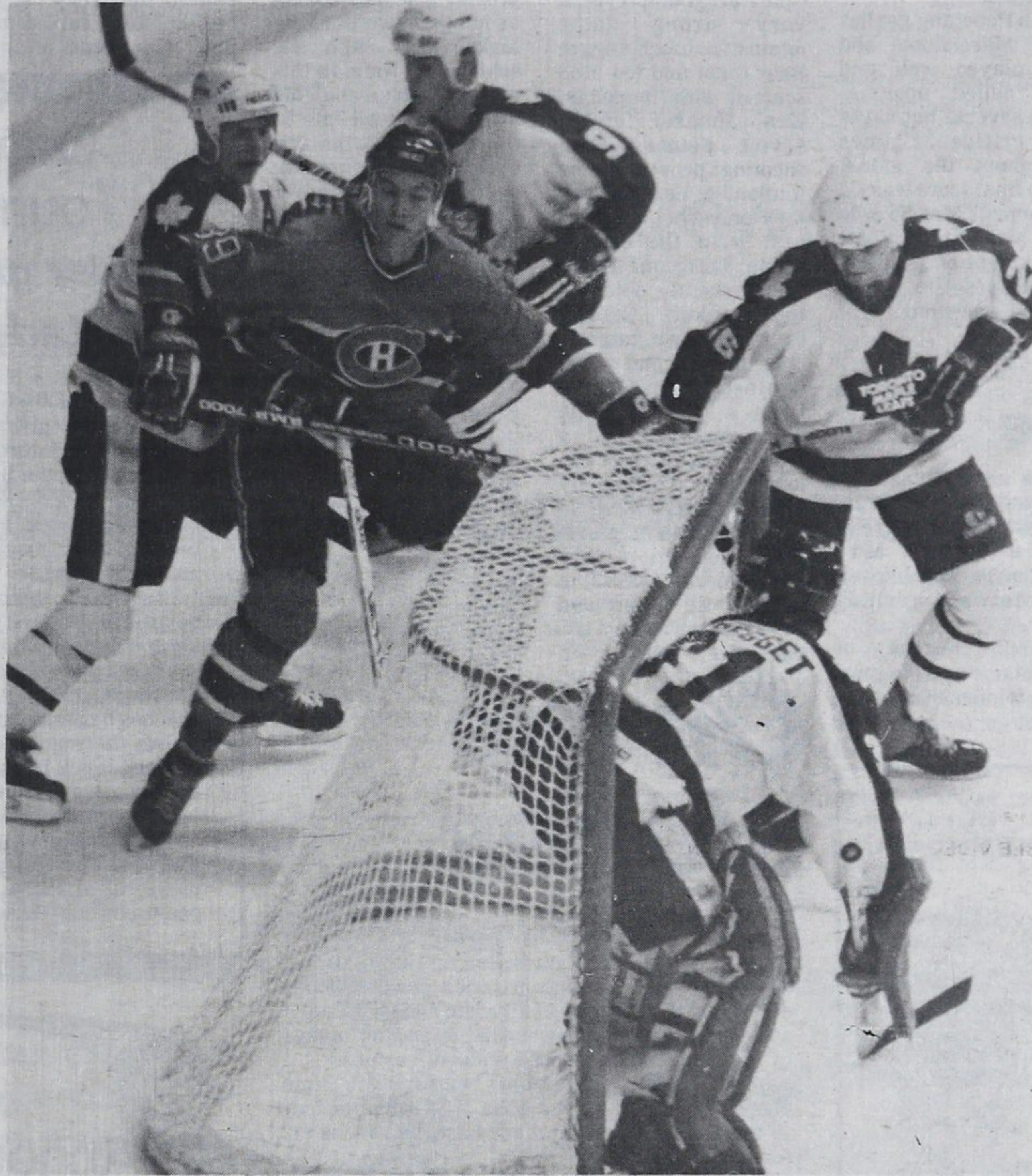
