# A sharing, learning experience being spear-headed by bereaved

There is something about losing a child which no pain can match.

Death at any age is tragic but especially if the one who dies is young. Losing a child is one of the most painful and traumatic experiences a family can have because it disrupts the well-being of the whole family and can create extreme tension between the parents. When a child (of any age) dies, life just isn't the same anymore.

About six months ago, a half dozen couples who had lost their children, started to come together to discuss their common pain.

those who knew what it was like. They cried a lot and sometimes didn't want to come. But they came anyway.

Do the pain and the memories ever stop? By slowly sharing their feelings and gradually learning to again, the trust memories were becoming detached from the pain. They noticed some change in their ability to cope with family, friends, and work; they knew, a lot of work had yet to be done, but at least now they can talk instead of
