Kings open playoffs with road victory

Penetang Jr. C Kings opened their first round of the playoffs Saturday night with a road victory in Stroud over Innisfil Bruins by a 6-4 score.

Kings jumped on the scoreboard with a trio of markers midway through the first frame within a span of two minutes when Scott Boyd, John O'Hara, and Steve Bauchman staked Penetang to a 3-0 lead.

Bruins retaliated with a marker from David Davies before the period ended.

Gary Lynch teamed up with Scott Hook and Mike Brunelle at 17:29 of the second stanza before Andy Walton tallied for Innisfil to stay within two.

Warren Hart came right back for Kings at 11:54 with help from John O'Hara and Don Monteith, but Davies found the range for his second of the contest before the period was over. Penetang led 5-3 at the end of two periods of play.

Scoring was light in

the third, as Warren Hart teamed up with Don Monteith at 7:24 and Davies fired his third of the game to make the final score 6-4 in favor of Penetang. Kings took 22 minutes in penalties in the contest to 18 for the hosts. Kings lead the best of seven quarter finals one game to none with game two being played last night in Penetang.

The third game is slated for tomorrow night in Penetang with an 8:30 p.m. start.

Ice conditions may not be too good as yet but ice huts are on the ice and fishermen are taking some good catches

on Simcoe. Not putting out the \$5 entry fee for the Lake Simcoe Ice Fishing Derby would be like heading out on the lake without tackle. Entry forms can be purchased from most ice hut operators around the lake. Good luck.

Two local men will think twice about transporting deer without having proper licences attached, and being in possession of illegal wild meat, come next year. Jules Lesperance and Morris Cascagnette received matching fines of \$503 for charges under the Game and Fish Act. Each pleaded guilty in court. In handing down the fine Judge Smith noted that Lesperance, with 25 years hunting experience, should have known better.

The incident revolved around a deer head without a tag and a heart and liver found in their possession. After an investigation by the Ministry of Natural Resources, charges were laid.

Midland's Angela Schmidt Foster copped the Canadian Cross Country Ski Championship in the five kilometer classic held at Alma, Quebec last Saturday.

Foster's time of 17 minutes, 05.6 seconds was over 28 seconds ahead of second place finisher Lorna Sasseville of Ottawa. Another top Canadian skier, Marie-Andree Masson of Arthabaska, Quebec, came in third.

On Sunday the trio of Schmidt Foster, Lisa Patterson, and Jane Vincent won the Canadian Senior Women's 3X5 kilometer relay championship for the Southern Ontario Division in a time of 55 minutes, 24.9 seconds, beating the Quebec 1 team by 26 seconds.

Bill Campbell tallied his second of the game 36 seconds later, but Pat Morris found the mark on a power play opportunity assisted by Archer and Bauchman with a minute and two seconds remaining in the game for an 8-3 triumph. Paul Steele in Kings' net, handled 30 Oro drives, while Penetang directed 42 shots at the Oro net.
