

Huntsville's last stand

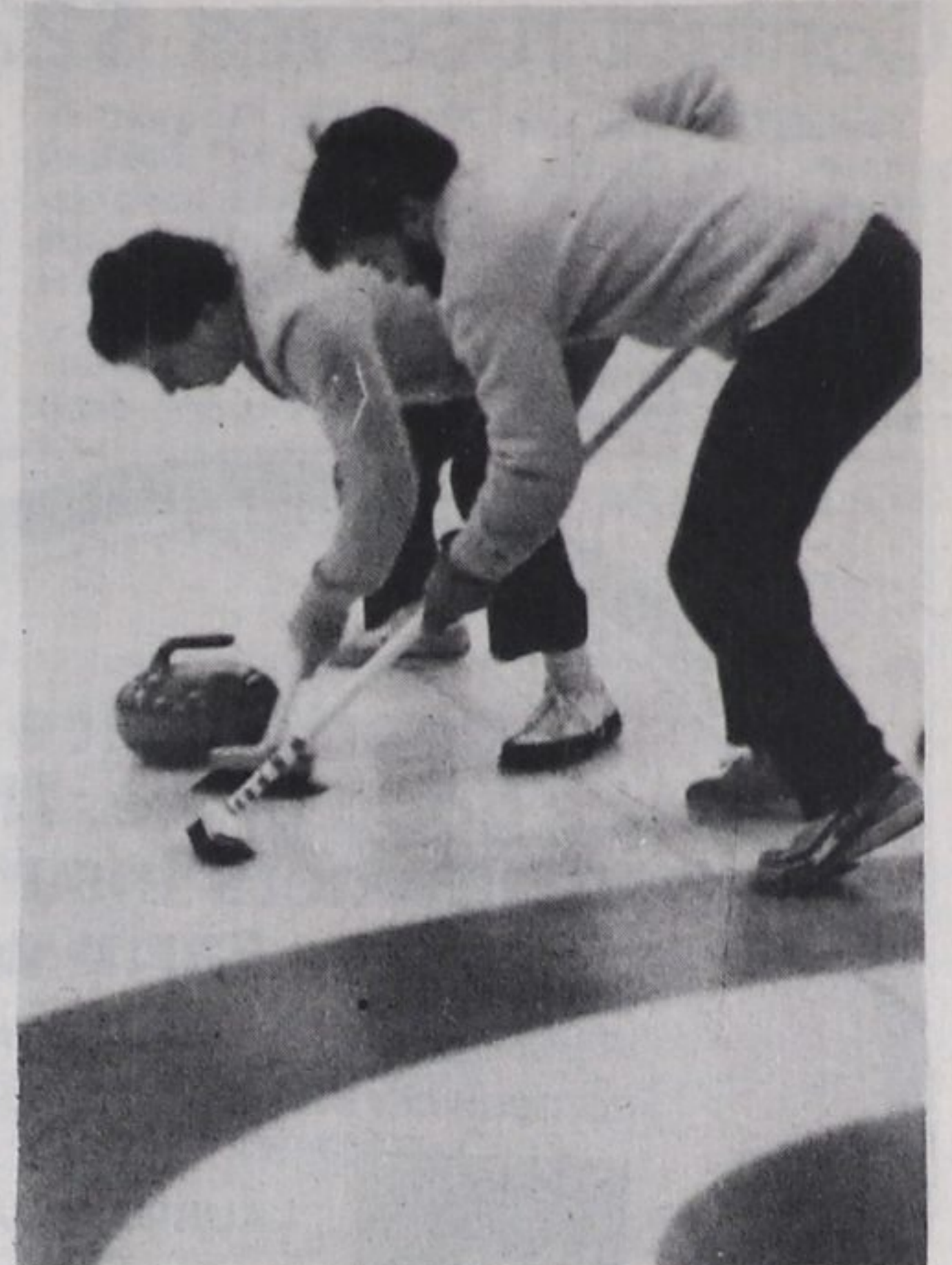
