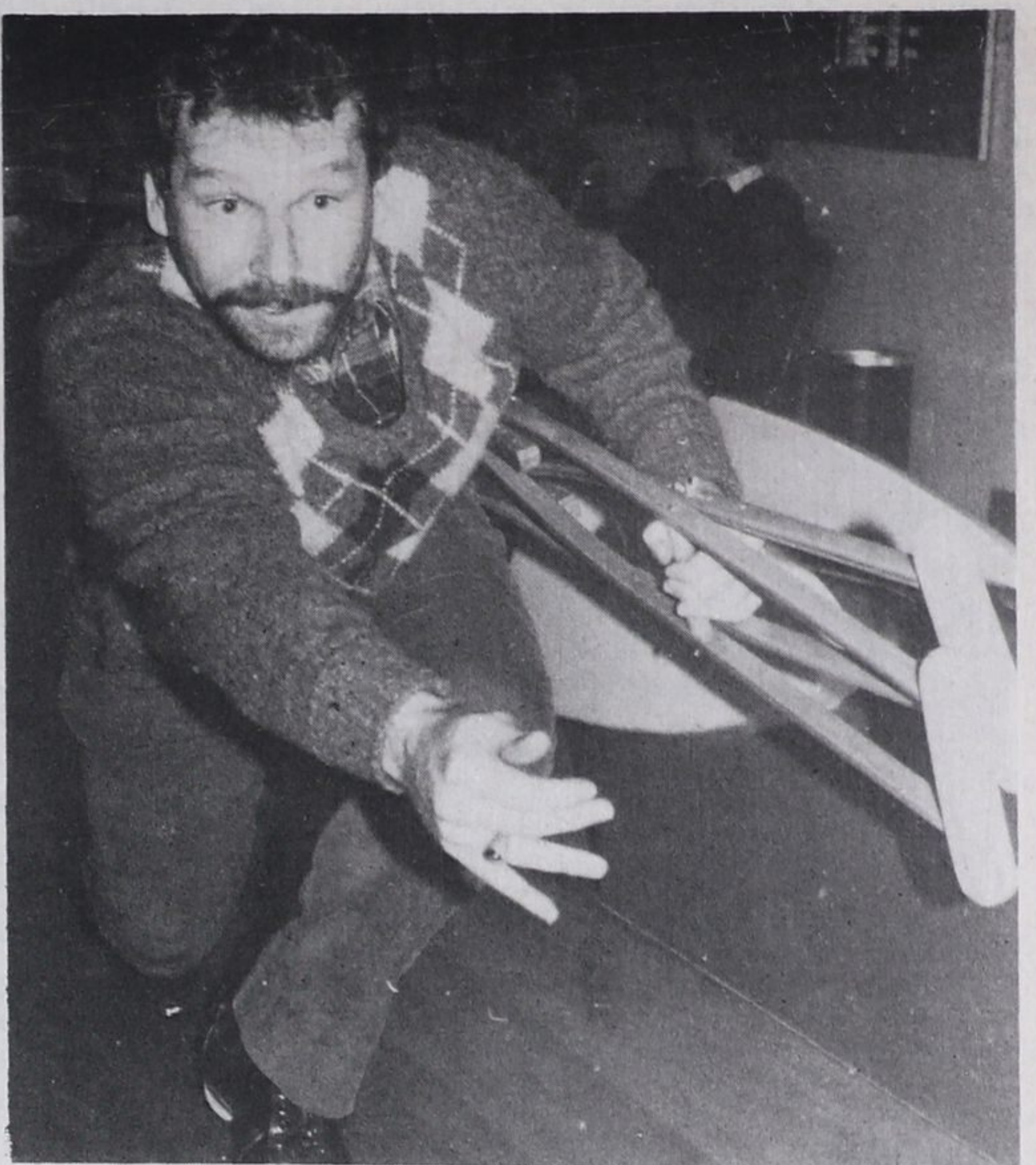
Maxwell, Wilma - passed away at the Toronto Western Hospital, on Saturday, March 8, 1986, in her 58th year. Wilma French of RR 1,
