So what had de Gaspe been doing all those years before he became French-Canadian literary equivalent to American painter Grandma Moses (honored on a U.S. stamp issued May 1, 1969, Scott 1370)?

De Gaspe came from an old, established seigneurial family. He studied law under the renowned Jonathan Sewell and was admitted to the bar in 1811. It was in 1811 that he

began to practise law and that he married Susanne Allison. They subsequently had 13 children.

Only five years later, in 1816, he became sheriff of Quebec City, an important position ina place where there was Napoleonic Law and not much British Common Law.

In those days, many feared the sheriff because he was a main person between debt and debtor's prison.

De Gaspe was to learn about it first hand.

De Gaspe was fired as sheriff in 1822 because he kept "faulty accounts." He left Quebec City to live at the seigneurial family home at Saint-Jean-Port-Joli, a few miles up the St. Lawrence River.

Times for him were relatively tough, it seems. He was in debtor's prison from 1838 to 1841.

It took a special Act of Parliament to effect his release.

De Gaspe, despite debtor's prison, does not seem to have been totally impoverished. Following his release from prison, he spent his summers at Saint-Jean-Port-Joli and wintered at Quebec City.

It was at this time that he became a frequent visitor to Octave Cremazie's bookstore, a hangout for French-Canadian writers and

other literary beings. In 1866, him memoirs were published. A third work, "Divers" was published in 1893, long after his death, Jan. 29, 1871 at Quebec City.

The quite attractive stamp, in four-color lithography, shows Aubert de Gaspe with a scene from his book, "The Debacle", as though he were examining it in his mind.

The design is by Yves Paquin.

If you want to be a hit at the spring meeting of your stamp club, you can point out what hardly anyone knows: The depiction Philippe Aubert de Gaspe is a faithful rendition of engraving in "Histoire des Canadiens-franc-

ais", Volume VI, by B. Sulte, published in 1882. It's in the Public Archives of Canada.

There are some other interesting facts about this stamp: It's printed on Rolland paper, a Canadian made coatedone-side paper for lithography, which may see the end of the imported papers from Harrison and Clark, except for future stamps printed through the engraving process.




