Wrestle Mania Two is coming up on Monday, April 7, 1986.

This event will be held in three major cities in the USA, Los Angeles, Chicago, and Long Island N.Y. and will be seen all over the USA, Canada, and 18 other countries on closed-circuit TV. Maple Leaf Gardens in Toronto will show it live on a 40 foot screen, and is already sold out of tickets.

Here is the WrestleMania 2 schedule.

From the Los Angeles Sports Arena, Hulk Hogan puts up the WWF World Title inside a steel cage, as he goes up against the man who put him in the hospital on the March 1 segment of Saturday Night's Main Event: King Kong Bundy (managed by Bobby The Brain Heenan).

At The Rosemont Horizon, in Rosemont III near Chicago, there will be a 20-man "over the top rope" Battle Royal featuring, Ed (Too Tall) Jones from the Dallas Cowboys, Jimbo Covert from the Chicago Bears, Bill Fralic of the Atlantic Falcons, Harvey Martin of the Dallas Cowboys, Russ Francis from the San Francisco 49ers, William The Refrigerator Perry of the Chicago Bears, The Iron Sheik, Ted Arcedi, Big John Studd, Tony (Mr. USA) Atlas, Andre The Giant, Danny Spivey, Brian Blair, Jim Brunzell, Hillbilly Jim, King Tonga, Jim Neidhart, Bruno Sammartino, Leaping Lanny Poffo and Pedro Morales.

Then from the Nassau Coliseum, Uniondale, Long Island N.Y., there will be a boxing match featuring Rowdy Roddy Piper going up against Mr. T. Piper will have Cowboy Bob Orton and Lou Duva in his corner, and Mr. T will have Joe Frazier in his corner.

The rest of the matches listed here are bouts originating from these three sites: W.W.F. Intercontinental Championship Match, Randy (The Macho Man) Savage champion will take on George (The Animal) Steele. Then a super tag team battle as Greg (The Mummer) Valentine and Brutus Beefcake once again put up the WWF Tag Team Title, this time with two referees, against The British Bulldogs.

There will also be a ladies world title match as The Fabulous Moolah takes on Velvet McIntyre. Plus the popular Paul (Mr. Wonderful) Orndorff will pair off against The Magnificent Muraco. Another great tag bout promises to be full of action and excitement as Terry and Hoss Funk face the team of Tito Santana and The Junk Yard Dog. Corporal Kirchner and Russia's Nikolai Volkoff will battle it out. Uncle Elmer the 400 pound country boy tangles against (adorable) Adrian Adonis. Then the Hawaii sensation Ricky (The Dragon) Steamboat battles it out against Bret (The Hit Man) Hart of the Hart Foundation. Jake (The Snake) Roberts will have his hands full as he takes on ex-footballer George Wells.

WrestleMania Two will also include celebrity guests. From the New York

segment of WrestleMania Two, G. Gordon Liddy will be guest judge, Joe Frazier will be in Mr. T's corner, Lou Duva will be in Piper's corner, special guest timekeeper (Herb), Darryl Dawkins is the guest judge, and the lovely Susan St. James as guest commentator.

Chicago will have Dick Butkus as a referee. (Where's The Beef) star Claire Peller as guest timekeeper, Cab Callaway is the tentative ring announcer, and Bing's daughter, Kathy Lee Crosby, has the job of being the guest commentator.

And finally from Los Angeles, guest timekeeper will be Ricky Schroder with the vampire lady Elvira as guest commentator.

Meanwhile at Maple Leaf Gardens Sunday March 23, 1986, a packed house saw Ricky (The Dragon) Steamboat defeat The Magnificent Muraco at 17:47 of their Martial Arts Match. Andre The Giant and The Junk Yard Dog won by disqualification over the team of Terry Funk, Hoss Funk, and Jimmy Hart in this special handicap match. The Hart Foundation; Jim (The Anvil) Niedhart and Brett (The Hit Man) Hart was victorious over The Killer Bees at 15:20. The Rougeau brothers from Montreal, Raymond and Jacques won over The Moondogs at 16:10 Jake (The Snake) Roberts got the nod over George Wells at 9:43. King Tonga beat Paul Christy at 9:30. Cowboy Bob Orton defeated Leaping Lanny Poffo at 13:24 Corporal Kirchner put away Big Mike Sharpe at 9:28.

Marlin Travellose close one

Three power play goals by Thorold led to a 4-1 first period lead in the third game of the best of seven Ontario Minor Hockey Association championship final series with Midland Marlin Travel Peewees at Centennial Arena Sunday. After the dust had cleared, Thorold motored out of town with a 9-5 win, and a two games to one lead.

Thorold's Brad Chapman opened up the scoring at 11:15 of the first frame, only to have minor peewee, Craig Dempsey, knot the score at 7:46. Larry Moore gave Thorold the lead at 3:57, while Owen Nolan and Chapman tallied with less than a minute left in the period for a 4-1 Thorold lead.

Nolan, Thorold's captain, scored the only goal of the second stanza to increase their lead to 5-1. The visitors didn't let up any as they fired three goals in a span of 44 seconds to open the final frame. Nolan and Chapman

each completed their hat tricks, while Jeff Yungblut notched his first of two on the game. Chris Bales, another player from the minor ranks, tallied at 9:13 with help from David Forest and Trevor Irvine. Yungblut then scored his second of the contest at 7:28 to make the score 9-2 for Thorold. Midland came back with three straight tallies within the last six minutes of the game as Gary Miller teamed up with Gary Moore and David Forest for two of the goals, and Moore accounted for the other from Forest and Chris Bales. Forest ended the game with five assists.

Midland scored five of their goals on the power play, while Thorold added three with an extra attacker.

The fourth game of this series reverts back to Thorold next Sunday, with the next home game slated for Centennial Arena Wednesday, April 9 with a 7:30 p.m. start.

Ontario's anglers face \$10 user fee

Thousands of Ontario anglers, who have enjoyed the privilege of fishing the province's many lakes and streams in the past for free, could now face a \$10 user fee.

The Ontario Minister of Natural Resources Vincent Kerrio is considering the licensing of all the province's anglers before the start of the 1987 fishing season.

Ministry's Huronia District Fish and Wildlife Supervisor Alex Smith said the move would bring Ontario up to par with every other province and state in the continent.

"Ontario is the only jurisdiction in North America that doesn't have an angling licence for its residents," said Smith.

As Kerrio's proposal stands, any angler between the ages of 18 and 64 would have to purchase a \$10 permit, with seniors (over 65) paying only \$5.

Smith said the Ministry already spends \$30 million annually for fisheries management but added more money is needed for protection, maintenance and improvement of the natural resource.

Provincial government estimates the fees from the new licences would provide an additional \$10 million a year to be used in fisheries management, enforcement of laws, rehabilitation, public education, stocking and expanded communications said the supervisor.

The proposal by the ministry is presently the subject of scrutiny at a number of public meetings the government has organized across the province.

Smith said the reaction from many of the angling associations and ardent anglers, who are making presentations at the public session, is very favorable with many

people suggesting the \$10 fee is not enough.

Not only would the suggested \$15 or \$20 fee add to government funding, but it would also deter many of the casual anglers from

heading to the waters.

President of the North Simcoe Anglers Conservation Club John Desroches said his organization favours the government proposal on one condition.

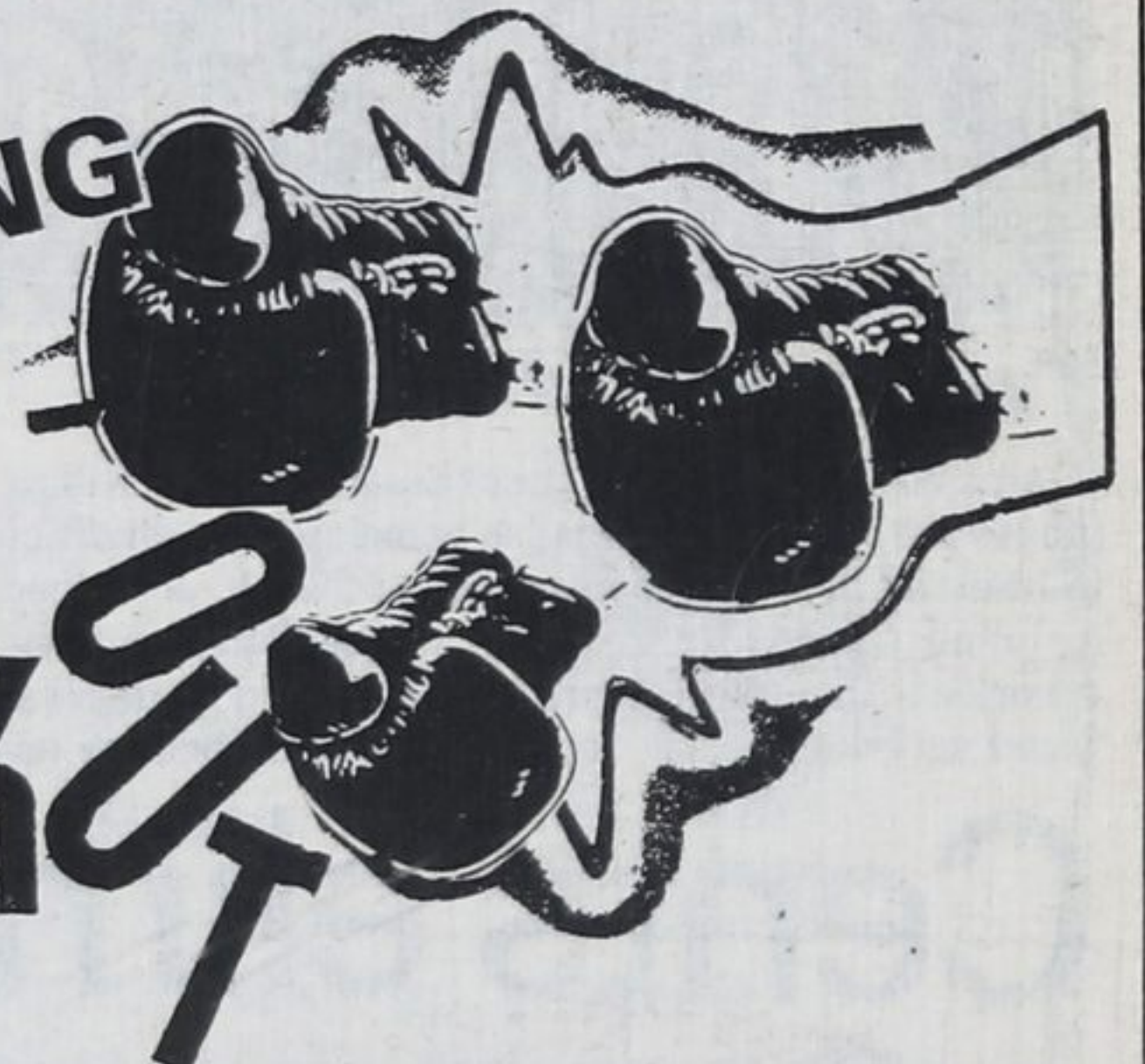
