# Canada Malting accepts better offer

Canada Malting Company of Toronto lost interest in buying a grain elevator in Midland because it got a better offer, Midland Economic Development Commissioner Matthew Parry says.

Canadian National Railways and Canadian Pacific Ltd. made Canada Malting "a better deal to stay in Toronto". Parry doesn't know the details: he speculated that Canada Malting might have been offered a special rail rate.

Last month Canadian National Railways offered for sale its Tiffin No. 2 grain elevator, located in east Midland. Last week Canadian National Railways public relations coorcinator Mike Matthews said that no bids were received, only two expressions of interest.
